

NEW HORIZONS THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT By: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

OUR LIVES ARE SHAPED BY OUR DECISIONS.

On this last week of Advent, the Scriptures present two figures who challenge us. The first is Ahaz and the second is Joseph.

Ahaz was king of Judah during the eighth century before Jesus. In the first reading the kingdom of Judah is being threatened by the kingdoms of the north, those of Israel and Syria. They are attempting to force Ahaz to enter into an Alliance against the Assyrian Empire. Assyria was the powerful world Empire of the time. The northern kingdoms had threatened to depose King Ahaz and place a new king on the throne of David if he did not go along with their wishes.

God asks Ahaz to ask for a sign which will prove that God will protect Judah. Ahaz does not have the faith to ask for a sign. Instead, Ahaz puts his trust in the Assyrian Empire. Ahaz' statement that he will not tempt the Lord means that he will rely on the strength of Assyria rather than on the Lord's strength.

Ahaz is called to place his trust in God and he is not able. In spite of Ahaz' fear and lack of trust, God gives him a sign. That sign is "the virgin will be with child, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." The sign is that before the son of the king is old enough to reject the bad and choose the good the lands of Israel and Syria will be deserted. The son who was born to one of the king's wives would be called Emmanuel, meaning that God would be present in a special way in this prince. This child was probably Hezekiah.

JOSEPH

The Gospel presents Joseph. Like Ahaz, Joseph is called to trust God.

Joseph is betrothed to Mary. Mary does not yet live with Joseph, but they have made a sacred commitment between themselves.

Joseph finds that Mary is pregnant. We can imagine the sadness in Joseph's life when he discovers that his wife is pregnant.

Joseph is a man who lives out the Law and the Law of Moses was clear: infidelity was adultery. An unfaithful woman had to be cast aside, stoned. Thus, Joseph decides to divorce her quietly so that he can protect her and yet live out the Law. In the midst of his fear and confusion, Joseph has a dream. An angel tells him to take Mary into his home. Joseph is told that Mary would bear a son and they would name him Jesus since he would save his people from their sins. The name Jesus is derived from the root in Hebrew of "God saves." The angel shows that Jesus is both Son of David as Joseph is in the line of David and that Jesus is Son of God, as he is conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Joseph is given a choice to put his trust in the Law of Moses or to put his trust in something new that is about to happen. Will he divorce Mary or take her into his home? In the midst of his fear and confusion Joseph is called to make a decision. Unlike King Ahaz, Joseph puts his trust in God.

As with Joseph, God challenges us. We are called to be aware of the ways that God speaks to us. If we know the Scriptures we will be able to follow the commands of the Lord, even if they come in challenging ways. May we always follow the path the Lord places before us.

GOD WANTS TO BE ONE WITH US

What great lengths God will go to in loving and saving us! Think of the most outlandish circumstance you might conceive. That seems to be what the Lord is saying to Ahaz in today's first reading. "A virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel." Not only is the idea of a virgin conceiving beyond comprehension in Ahaz's time, so would the concept of God wanting to be with us be, as the name Emmanuel indicates. And yet, this is what we celebrate in the Incarnation—God wants so completely to be one with us that God came to be with us in a son born to a virgin, the Blessed Virgin Mary. There is more to this story than even these amazing and outlandish occurrences, however. God wants to be one with us so deeply that God partners with us to make God's presence known. Copyright © J. OUR FASCINATING FAITH Las Posadas (December 16–24)

Of the many Latin American traditions for the celebration of Advent and Christmas, the tradition of *Las Posadas* seems to be the best known. It originated in the last half of the eighteenth century when the boisterous *Misas de Aguinaldo* were no longer celebrated in Mexico. To replace these Masses, the laity decided to celebrate in their own homes by taking what they had seen dramatized in the churches: the journey of the Galilean immigrants, Joseph and Mary of Nazareth, when they were looking for an inn (*posada*) in Bethlehem of Judea. Like the "O Antiphons" of the official liturgy, these *posadas* were celebrated on nine consecutive nights.

The journey of Joseph and Mary from inn to inn sadly continues every day in the fearful and tired steps taken by so many immigrants in this country. Like the Holy Family, Latin American families look for hospitality with the hope of finding a new life for their sons and daughters. Unfortunately, many citizens of the United States behave like the people of Bethlehem, preferring to close their door in the face of the immigrants rather than welcoming them. Perhaps that is the reason that the tradition of *Las Posadas* has taken on so much importance among the Latinos in the United States. We know firsthand what Joseph and Mary experienced two thousand years ago. We have to ask ourselves: When will the human heart change?
