NEW HORIZONS
Vocations and the Family

This weekend I invite the community to reflect on how their family can better foster vocations. The word vocation comes from the Latin word *vocare* which means to call. We are to allow the call of God to take root and to grow within us. The environment of the family allows that call to be heard and to grow in one's life and that was certainly true in my life.

I believe that God calls each of us. Most are called to marry their spouse in the Sacrament of Marriage. Others are called to serve the Church through Baptism as a Religious Sisters, Brothers, Priests or Monks. Those who do not marry are also called to bring Christ to the world through the Sacrament of Baptism. Through Holy Orders Deacons, Priests and Bishops are empowered to live out their vocation of service in the Church. It is important for all of us to be open to God's call and to allow that call to grow within us. I heard God's call to the priesthood through prayer, service and family life.

The image that best helps me understand the call of God is the Parable of the Sower. In that parable God is portrayed as a farmer who goes out to sow seed. The farmer lavishly throws his seed onto the field. The seed is as fruitful as the ground on which it falls. Some seed falls on a path and the birds come and eat it up. Other seed falls on rocky ground where there is little soil and it springs up at once but is soon scorched by the sun. Some seed falls among thorn bushes and is unable to grow for lack of sunlight. But some falls on rich soil and produces much fruit. Jesus explains to his disciples that the seed is the Word of God. The path, the rocky ground, the thorn bushes and the rich soil represent our lives. Jesus says that Satan, anxiety and worldly desires can hinder us from receiving the Word of God and bearing fruit. How open are our lives to receiving God's Word? The parable symbolizes our lives. God sows his Word and we can accept that Word and allow it to take root and to grow in our lives or we can be closed to the Word and not allow the Word to take root within us.

I believe the call of God was able to enter my life and to grow within me as a result of the love, acceptance, trust and faith that I experienced in my family. My parents openly loved each other and each one of their children. They trusted me as I discerned how God was calling me to follow him. My family had a great love for the Church which was shown through our weekly attendance at Mass, through our values and through our family prayer. This faith helped to shape my life beginning in college and beyond. This lifestyle led to a general openness to God which ultimately led to my discerning and saying yes to God's call to the priesthood. Mom and Dad never told me that I should be a priest. In fact, they never really invited me to consider the priesthood. Their love, trust and faith created the environment in which I could value God's Word and discern God's call to the priesthood.

While my parents never spoke to me about the priesthood, I invite parents to encourage their children to consider deaconate, priesthood and Religious Life. This is especially true if a child expresses an interest in a Church vocation. The life of a priest is one of leading others to God through preaching, through celebrating the sacraments and through leading a church community. Children should be allowed to freely make decisions about vocations. I truly believe that a vocation that represents God's will for a person is the vocation that will make him/her most happy in life.

May our families be places of love and acceptance in which we can hear the voice of God and in which the Word of God can take root and grow within our lives.

GOD'S LOVING CARE

Two readings today refer to the northeast region of ancient Israel: "the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali." Upon hearing these names, some of us might consult maps and determine exactly where these regions lie. Others might let the unfamiliar names drift by unnoticed. If no maps are handy—but we don't want to ignore the references completely—consider this: we might not know the latitude and longitude of Zebulun and Naphtali, but God does. We praise God for watching over every inch of land and sea, caring perfectly for each creature on the planet. While Isaiah celebrates the depth of God's care with "abundant joy and great rejoicing," Saint Paul begs us to remember how the Lord shows this loving care: through the cross. In today's Gospel, Jesus calls Peter, James, and John to follow him. We follow too, confident that God accompanies us, wherever we are. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

Ordinary Time

Between the end of the Christmas season and the start of Lent, the liturgical year begins a period known as Ordinary Time. That season is interrupted by the seasons of Lent and Easter, and then resumes again after Pentecost. The English translation of the Latin name for this season has received much criticism because of our association of the word "ordinary" with something of lesser value, the opposite of something special. Critics point out that Sunday is the original feast day of the Church, that there is nothing at all "ordinary" about our weekly celebration of the Lord's dying and rising. Translators explain that in this context the English word "ordinary" retains the root meaning of "ordinal," something counted "in order," and that the Sundays throughout the year are in fact named by their numerical order. It is helpful to understand how all five of the "special" seasons of the liturgical year (Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter) fit together to unfold the single mystery of Christ. As we continue the year now with Ordinary Time, we are mindful that what we celebrate is indeed as "extraordinary" an experience of God's grace as one could ever imagine. Copyright © J. S. In this Sunday's Gospel, we find that Jesus "... went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people."

This month, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was able to proclaim the good news of the kingdom to those in need.

Hope everyone had a blessed Christmas and New Year. I made bulletin announcements my main resolution this year. I'm glad to see 2022 gone! In December we fed 80 people, which included 40 children, 30 adults, 5 seniors, and 4 homeless. We were open only 2 weeks. There is a lot of need out there now. For 1,810 pounds of food distributed, the cost was \$27.76. Twelve families were helped with utilities at a cost of \$995. We had 69 angels on the tree in 2022. About a dozen angels were left on the tree.

Panic time! One of our Sacred Heart angels took a big handful of angels. We had enough money left for the rest. Thanks to everyone for help in organizing and bagging the gifts. Times are hard, so everyone gave what they could. We are blessed. Hope everyone has a wonderful New Year. Instead of food this time, we are asking people for socks. We are out and its wintertime. If you prefer to buy food, cereal is always popular.
