With an extremely heavy heart, I announce we will be ceasing our association with J. S. Paluch. They had a 110-year mission to provide communication tools to Catholic Parishes across the United States. Our last print edition is this bulletin.

The management team at J.S. Paluch spent innumerable hours over the last decade applying cost cutting measures to cope with various economic, supply chain, and labor challenges, not to mention the disastrous impact COVID-19 and related lockdowns had on Church attendance. Despite every effort, we were unable to overcome rising costs and decreased advertiser support to enable J.S. Paluch to continue to deliver to you and your parishioners the quality product that has been our hallmark for over a century.

Over the past 18 months, we spent countless hours attempting to place all of our parishes with other bulletin providers and were successful in doing so with over half of our parishes. Unfortunately, however, we were unable to find a bulletin provider willing to take a direct assignment of your contract to enable your parish to continue receiving bulletins under your current contract terms. Regretfully, we have no choice but to advise you the last bulletin to be delivered to you by J.S. Paluch will be for the weekend of February 25-26, 2023. There are a number of reputable bulletin providers you should contact.

As the current president of J.S. Paluch and the granddaughter of its founders, John S. and Martha Paluch, I am extremely grateful to you for supporting our efforts over the years, as well as to our advertisers who have enabled us to supply you with cost-free bulletins and each and every employee who has graced J.S. Paluch with their dedication, creativity, and effort. I can tell you that making the decision to terminate operations has been a tremendously difficult and emotionally draining one. Please join me in thankful praise to my blessed grandparents, who in 1913 conceived and brought to life the idea of delivering printed bulletins to Churches in the Archdiocese of Chicago, and to my blessed parents, Chester J. and Margaret (Mickey) A. Paluch, who continued this tradition and dedicated their lives to bringing meaningful spiritual messages in professionally prepared weekly bulletins to thousands of parishes across the United States and Puerto Rico. Please also keep our employees in your prayers as they seek new opportunities.

On behalf of the Paluch family, please know we are extremely grateful to you and your parish for having supported our efforts these many years and we wish you Godspeed!

The Lenten season is a fresh invitation to explore again who God is, who we are, and what it means to be human. We begin by hearing the tragic story of the first humans in the book of Genesis. As Paul describes in Romans, our struggles started when our ancestors broke the bond of unity with God, sought self-sufficiency, and grew apart from their true purpose and identity. In Matthew's Gospel, we see how Jesus resists the lure of living outside of unity with God. Jesus rejects false promises of possessions, power, and status. Instead, he puts his life in his Father's hands. As our model for living as a fully human person, Jesus demonstrates that we are created to live in relationship with and trust in God, and in harmony with and for all of creation.

### **OUR FASCINATING FAITH** l ent

One of the liturgical reforms mandated at the Second Vatican Council was that the focus of the season of Lent should be restored as a time of preparation for—or renewal of—baptism. The bishops at the Council were aware of the fact that the origins of Lent as a distinctive liturgical season lay in the early centuries when the Church celebrated the sacraments of Christian initiation only once a year, at the Easter Vigil. In order to prepare those who were to receive those sacraments, a special period of preparation (eventually lasting forty days) gradually developed.

By the time of the Second Vatican Council, the initiatory character of Lent had long been forgotten, and it had become simply a time of penance focused on individual spiritual renewal. The introduction of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and the revision of the Lectionary after the Council have changed all of that. Now the Sunday scripture readings during Lent are very carefully selected with an eye to the journey of those preparing to be initiated at the Easter Vigil. Once again, the entire community is asked to undergo penance in solidarity with the candidates for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Thus, in order to appreciate fully the meaning of the readings during this season, the "filter" through which they must be heard is always the knowledge that we are helping to prepare our sisters and brothers in the catechumenate for their initiation at the Easter Vigil.
