NEW HORIZONS PALM SUNDAY 2023

PASSION OF MATTHEW

The Gospel of this weekend is the Passion Narrative of Matthew. Let us reflect on the significant decisions made by various characters in the Passion Narrative.

JUDAS

The Gospel begins with Judas going to the chief priests and asking how much they would give him to hand over Jesus. They promise 30 pieces of silver and Judas consents to hand Jesus over. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Judas approaches Jesus and betrays him with a kiss. Jesus is then arrested. After the death of Jesus, Judas who is overcome with guilt attempts to return the 30 pieces of silver. The chief priests and elders won't accept the money. Tragically Judas gives in to despair rather than to return to the community of the disciples and in so doing accept the forgiveness of Christ.

PETER AND THE DISCIPLES

At the end of Jesus' trial before the Sanhedrin, Peter denies knowing Jesus three times. Soon afterwards a cock crows three times. Peter goes out and weeps bitterly. Peter represents one who is placed in a situation of fear and acts out of that fear.

PONTIUS PILATE

After the trial before the Jewish Sanhedrin, Jesus is sent to the Roman Governor Pontius Pilate. Pilate knows that Jesus is innocent of a crime. The Jewish leaders argue that Jesus should be crucified, and a criminal Barabbas should be set free. Pilate knows that Jesus is innocent but ultimately, gives in to the shouts of the crowd. Do we ever do what is not right in order to protect ourselves from others?

THE WOMEN UNDER THE CROSS

Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James and Joseph and the mother of the sons of Zebedee had followed Jesus from Galilee. While in Galilee they had ministered to the needs of Jesus. In faith these women decide to follow Jesus to the cross. The two Mary's will later journey to the tomb and to their surprise find it empty. Unlike the disciples who flee from the cross, they put themselves at risk out of love for Jesus.

JESUS

Matthew also places before us the example of Jesus. In the Garden Jesus prays that the cup of suffering be taken from him. While Jesus prays to God that his cup of suffering pass by him, he ultimately accepts God's will. By the end of his prayer Jesus is resolute and ready to face his crucifixion. Throughout the Passion Narrative, Jesus is shown to submit to God's will as presented in the Scriptures.


Jesus' suffering on the cross shows his trust in God's power. From the cross Jesus quotes Psalm 22, the psalm of a righteous sufferer. At the end of the psalm God vindicates the sufferer. In the resurrection God will vindicate Jesus. For Jesus, pain and suffering do not have the last word.

CONCLUSION

This Holy Week may Jesus and the women at the cross be examples to us of resolute faith. May we continue to live this faith throughout our lives.
