

New Horizons-Easter 2023 By: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

Happy Easter! When have you experienced the Risen Christ in your life? Easter reminds us that the Risen Lord is always with us and gives us the hope of eternal life. May we live as a People of Hope.

Our Gospel begins by stating that as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. They had both witnessed the death and burial of the Lord and now encounter the empty tomb. The resurrection of Our Lord represents the dawning of a new day of salvation. The women come to the tomb with a sense of deep sorrow and defeat. They attempt to prepare his body for burial. As they arrive at the tomb there was a great earthquake which represents God's kingdom breaking into the world.

An angel came down from heaven and rolled away the stone and sat upon it. The women encounter the angel who shows them the empty tomb and sends them to proclaim the resurrection to the disciples.

On the way from the tomb the women experience the risen Christ. Christ first tells the women "Do not be afraid. (Mt 28:10)" Upon seeing the Risen Christ the women worship him. The risen Christ tells the women to go to the disciples and tell them that He has risen and that they will encounter him in Galilee. They go off to proclaim this message to the disciples.

In the Gospel of Mark, the women are fearful and their fear leads to silence. Whereas, in the Gospel of Matthew the women leave the tomb in great joy and successfully bring the message of the resurrection to the disciples. Christ wants the women and us to know that since He has risen they and us are to not be afraid. The Risen Christ will never abandon us. Jesus who suffered greatly is also with us in the midst of our sufferings. We need to hear Christ say to us "Do not be afraid!" The Christ who was raised from the dead two thousand years ago is still a part of our lives.

We like the women are sent forth by the risen Christ to make the message of salvation known. We are sent out to let others know that Christ is alive and that Christ wishes to draw all to himself. Just as God took flesh in the life of Jesus so Christ takes flesh in our lives. As members of the Body of Christ we truly make the resurrected Christ known in the world.

Before I preached my Easter homily three years ago I reflected on a question that I heard on CNN. The interview took place at the beginning of the pandemic A religious leader was asked CAN WE CANCEL EASTER? His answer was no, because Jesus rose over two thousand years ago. I say we can cancel Easter only if we lack faith in the presence of Christ and the future hope which come from the resurrection.

Many of the Jewish people of Jesus' time believed that the resurrection of the dead would happen at the end of time. The resurrection of Jesus shows that God's kingdom has already broken into the world. The appearances of Jesus in the New Testament are certainly proof that Jesus rose. The greatest proof of the resurrection is the transformation that has taken place in the lives of Christians throughout the centuries. The living faith and transformation of our lives is proof of the resurrection in today's world.

May we never lose sight of the presence of the Risen Lord in our lives and of the hope of the resurrection. May we constantly give thanks to God for this great gift.
