# NEW HORIZONS The Way, the Truth and the Life by: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

I love to hike. This love started when I was a boy scout in my teenage years. Some of you have seen photos of the hikes that I take in the hills to the side of my mother's house in California.

While I love to hike I have a terrible sense of direction. I have gotten lost in the most interesting places. I have gotten lost in the market of Casa Blanca in Morocco, on a glacier in Switzerland, during a snow storm, in the outskirts of the Vatican, in the Old City of Jerusalem, in the hills surrounding Lake Tahoe and on the Camino to the city of Santiago de Compostela.

Fortunately, through lots of work and plenty of ingenuity I have always found my way back. The Gospel today reminds us that life is a journey and that Jesus is the needed guide through whom we find our way to eternal life. On this journey Christ works through us so that the presence of Christ will continue to be made known.

#### LAST SUPPER

The setting of today's Gospel is the Last Supper. Jesus knows that his disciples are experiencing sadness as they contemplate his impending death. At the end of the Last Supper Jesus begins a farewell discourse. Jesus tells the disciples not to let their hearts be troubled because it is to their benefit that he leaves in order to be with God the Father. Jesus says that he is going to the realm of his Father in order to prepare a place for them to dwell. And in the future he will return to take the disciples to himself so that they will be in communion with the Father.

The words of Jesus remind us that our lives are also a journey to the Father. The words of Jesus remind us that what is most important is not our lives in this world but instead our final destiny, eternal life. Jesus tells the disciples that he is "the way the truth and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me" (John 14:5-6). Jesus shows that faith in him leads one to God the Father. Jesus challenges Philip to believe that he and the Father are one. And so, oneness with the Father comes through belief and trust in Jesus. Thus, we experience God through the life and words of Jesus. This unity between Jesus and the Father is seen as the Father accomplishes his works through Jesus.

Jesus than promises that those who believe in him will do the works that he does. The disciples will do these works because Jesus will work through them. The works of the disciples done after the departure of Jesus will surpass the works of Jesus because Jesus will be present in his absence. Jesus will do the works that the disciples request. There will be an in-between-time during which the disciples must ask in Jesus' name and he will continue to do the works of the Father among them.

Jesus' death and journey to the Father allows Jesus to be with his disciples in a special way. The ongoing presence of the absent Jesus will be found in the worshipping community. The members of the community will associate themselves with the departed Jesus, asking in his name. The glory of God, once seen in the deeds of Jesus, will be seen in the deeds of the worshipping community. These works of the community will be greater than even the works of Jesus. They will be done as a result of asking in the name of Jesus. May we have faith that Christ will be present through our lives as members of the Church.

#### Spiritual and Religious

The question is often asked why you need religion at all. Can't you just be a spiritual person and go directly to God? Especially in the wake of scandal, doesn't it seem like all human institutions have failed in one way or another to transmit the Gospel to all people at all times?

Years ago a very popular Youtube video showed a man speaking poetry claiming that he loved Jesus but hated religion. This seems to be a modern response to the horrible tragedies that have happened in religious institutions over the course of history, and these tragedies should not ever go unnoticed or the victims of these tragedies be forgotten.

Though it may be coming from a genuine place of concern for people to say they don't need religion, it is clear from the very beginning that Jesus founded a religion, a visible Church. He knew better than anyone that people could come directly to him, but he didn't set it up that way. In today's First Reading we hear a beautiful story of the early Church organizing and ordaining more priests in order to serve the growing needs of the flock. Right from the very beginning in Acts 6 we see the need for a visible Church that can bring the visible Christ to visible people with tangible needs.

Of course we can always go directly to God, but as human beings we often get in our own way. I know many Protestant friends who ask God directly for forgiveness and then have to struggle through mental games wondering if they truly are sorry and repentant. One of the benefits to a visible Church and visible sacraments is that we don't need to guess. Even Catholics can go directly to God and make a perfect act of contrition, but we are required by Canon Law to confess our sins to a priest, not because the Church wants to assure that we feel embarrassed about our sins, but so that we can have the assurance of forgiveness.

Though the Church is not perfect because it is full of very sinful people, myself included, being spiritual and not religious constantly leaves us wondering or worried about where we stand before God. With the Sacraments we need not worry, we have the assurance of Christ.

So take hope during this Easter season that God has set up a Church, that it is a visible body with authority, and that by living in this Church we can be assured that God is working for our salvation, despite the things we do or the lies we believe. Why not have the best of both worlds? Let's make it a point this Easter season to be spiritual and also religious, clinging to the hope that Jesus brings through his death and resurrection.
