

New Horizons Sixth Sunday of Easter 2023 By: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

Six weeks ago, beginning with the Easter Vigil, we began to celebrate a new holy Season, the Easter Season. This season has been one of celebrating the new life that we have received through the resurrection of Our Lord.

While we continue to rejoice in the Lord's the resurrection, today's first reading and Gospel turn our focus to the coming of the Holy Spirit. This new focus is beneficial as our world needs the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. In these final two weeks before we celebrate Pentecost let us pray that the Holy Spirit will become a greater part of our lives.

Our Gospel takes place at the Last Supper. As the life of Jesus draws to a close, Jesus shares that which is most important with his disciples. Jesus tells the disciples that he will not leave them as orphans but instead will send them the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. The meaning of Advocate in John's Gospel is one who teaches. Jesus is the first Advocate who revealed the Father's truth to the world. Now he promises to send them the Holy Spirit who will continue to make himself present and to reveal the truth of the Father to the disciples. Jesus then states that he will not only send them the Holy Spirit but that he will come back to them.

Jesus departs to the Father in order to live with the Father, and to send the Holy Spirit to abide in the lives of the disciples. The Holy Spirit will continue the work of Jesus in the lives of his disciples. Thus, Jesus will come back to the disciples through the presence of the Holy Spirit.

The first reading of today's Mass is from The Book of the Acts of the Apostles which was written by St. Luke. St. Luke has a different perspective of the Holy Spirit from the author of the Gospel of John. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is a prophetic Messiah. At the end of his life he dies, rises and ascends to the Father in order to send his Holy Spirit into the lives of his disciples so that they can continue his work in the world. The Book of Acts shows the disciples bringing the Good News of Jesus to the ends of the earth. In our first reading Philip, filled with the Holy Spirit, continues the teaching and miraculous works of Jesus in Samaria. The reading shows the growth of the church. After being baptized in the name of Jesus, Peter and John pray over Samaritans so that they too can receive the Holy Spirit.

A third perspective of the Holy Spirit is that the Holy Spirit is the person of the Trinity who gives new life. In Creed we refer to the Holy Spirit as the giver of life. The Holy Spirit brought about new life at the creation of the world. The Spirit was at work when Jesus was conceived in the womb of Mary. The Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles and transformed them on Pentecost Day and the church was born. The Holy Spirit continues to give us new life through Baptism. We are transformed by the new life of the Holy Spirit.

We are filled with the Holy Spirit through our Baptism and Confirmation. We live in a world that is in great need of the presence of Jesus Christ. May we continue to do the work of Christ in our world as did the early apostles. As we approach Pentecost let us pray that we will yield to the work of the Holy Spirit within our lives.




GRADUATES
