NEW HORIZONS THE ASCENSION

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension. Many people understand the Ascension to be simply the celebration of the end of the earthly life and appearances of Jesus. The Gospel writers present a different view.

Our first reading is taken from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. The Acts of the Apostles is the second volume written by Luke. The first volume is the Gospel of Luke which focuses on the ministry of Jesus and ends with his suffering, death, resurrection and ascension. In the Gospel the Ascension looks back on the ministry of Jesus. The Book of the Acts of the Apostles begins with the Ascension of Jesus. In the Acts of the Apostles the Ascension looks ahead to the establishment of the church and the future missionary travels of the Apostles.

In the Gospel of Luke Jesus is presented as a prophetic figure like Elijah. Just as Elisha the follower of Elijah asks for and receives a double portion of Elijah's spirit so the Apostles watch the risen Christ ascend on high and are given the promise of receiving the Spirit of Christ. Thus, for Luke the Ascension makes the receiving of the Holy Spirit possible for the Apostles. Empowered with the Holy Spirit they will continue the teaching and works of Jesus.

Our Gospel is from St. Matthew. The Ascension marks the end of the Gospel of Matthew. In the Ascension Christ commissions his Apostles to baptize and to teach. The disciples are not only to imitate Jesus by teaching the Jewish people but they are to preach to all the nations. The Gospel of Matthew ends with the hopeful verse, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt 28:20). Luke focuses on the Holy Spirit being with the Apostles after the Ascension of Christ. Matthew says that Christ himself will be with his Apostles and the Christian community.

Our second reading is taken from Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Ephesians presents the enthronement of Christ. All of the power of God resides in Christ. For Paul the Resurrection, Ascension, and glorification of Christ are one great continuous act of the Father. The Ascension and glorification of Christ is shared by the Church which is united to Christ, its head. Through Christ, God's power is made available to the Church. Paul writes about principalities and powers, which were angelic spirits, some good and some evil, who had power over human events and destiny. Since Christ has conquered them, no present or future force can block God's work of salvation.

The Ascension reminds us that life on earth is not eternal. Our lives are a journey to eternal life. One day we will pass through death into the eternity of God. Presently we are called to prepare for eternal life through love, forgiveness, faith, care for the least and generosity. As we reflect on the Ascension of Jesus we are both to give thanks for the presence of the Holy Spirit and of Christ in our lives now. At the same time we are to reflect on the eternal life to which God calls us. Do we embrace the salvation that Christ offers through living out the values of the Gospel?


May 21, 2023: Ascension of the Lord:
