# Homily – The Treasure in the Field By: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

In 1984 Jeremy Levin was the Bureau Chief of the Beirut Office of CNN. On Ash Wednesday of that year, he was kidnapped by Shiite Muslims. His kidnappers blindfolded him and brought him to a small, dingy house in the Bekka Valley.

Jeremy was chained to the wall in such a way that he could only sit down or lay down. He stayed that way for the next four weeks. He felt great loneliness and wanted to speak to anyone. In that situation Jeremy began to think about God. At the time he was an avowed atheist. He kept thinking of God and finally he wondered if he could speak to God. First he would not give in to speaking to God. Finally, he began to think about phrases such as, "God loves you." On Tuesday, April 12, he woke up and made an act of faith in God. He next prayed for his wife and his family and asked that they would one day be reunited. He next forgave his captors and asked God to forgive them.

On Christmas Eve one of his captors asked him what he wanted for Christmas. He asked for a Bible. Two days later he received a Bible. He constantly read the Bible. He was especially moved by Jesus' words, "All that you ask for in prayer, believe that you will receive it and it shall be yours" (Mk 11:24). From that moment on Jeremy prayed for an opportunity to escape. On the night of February 13, 1985, due to the carelessness of a guard, Jeremy was able to leave the house and run down the mountainside barefoot to safety.

Jeremy understood that although his captors meant to harm him God brought good out of the challenging situation. In the second reading St. Paul writes, "All things work for good for those who love God." The story of Jeremy shows us that even tragedies can work for good for those who love God. God can also bring good out of the tragedies of our lives. The above story is taken from the December 1986 edition of Guideposts.

In the Gospel a man by surprise finds a treasure. The man then hides it by reburying it in the field. The treasure is so valuable that he sells everything to obtain the treasure. In the same way during his captivity, Jeremy Levin found the treasure of God and then gave his whole life to following God. In the finding of the pearl the focus is on the deliberate search for something of great value. Encountering the Kingdom of heaven should elicit a single -minded response. In the same way we are to give our whole lives to God. What would our lives be like if we gave our entire lives to God?


The third parable describes a net which brings in many different animals from the sea. The good are kept in buckets and the others are thrown away. We are not to judge but instead let God judge and set things straight at the final judgement. This speaks of trust in God's judgment and patience and tolerance in the present. This is an important message for us today as we experience such division in our world.

Jesus ends his teaching by saying that a scribe who has been instructed in the kingdom of heaven is like the head of a household who brings from his storeroom both the new and the old. We are such a scribe when we study both the old and the new testaments.

May we be people who give our entire lives to the risen Christ, and may our faith shape the way we live.

# Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time A Truly Wise Person

The ending of today's Gospel speaks about "the new and the old." Jesus is saying that a person "instructed in the kingdom" has wisdom both old and new; in other words, that person learns from the past as well as from the present. Let's look at each of those.

We learn from the past by studying it. So the wisdom of the Kingdom comes first from the scriptures. The more familiar we are with the word of God, the more wisdom we possess. Along with studying the scriptures, we must pray over them and ask the Spirit to show us how they apply to our lives. We can also learn from the lives of the saints and writings of the Church. The saints may have lived extraordinary lives, but they all began as ordinary people who gave their lives to Christ. The writings of the Church, though sometimes very technical, contain the wisdom of centuries of living the faith. If you only have time to go to Mass on Sunday, just listening to the homily can help to apply the scriptures to your life.

One way we can learn from "the new" is to learn from our mistakes. That includes learning from our sins. When we are truly sorry, we make an effort to change our ways. You might say we have to learn a new way to respond to that situation. In the Bible, the word repentance itself means a change of heart, a new way of seeing and doing things.

We can also learn from the mistakes and the successes of our friends. As we share our faith with them, we share the stories of our lives, both good and bad. These stories can teach how to live our faith (or how not to!). One of the advantages of having friends whom we trust enough to confess our faults to is that we do not have to figure out life on our own. God can speak to us through a friend or relative whose advice we seek. A truly wise person is one who has received a lifetime of good advice.
