

NEW HORIZONS STEPPING OUT IN FAITH

FAITH

Faith is a relationship with God. Relationships can only be sustained through communication. In our first reading Elijah the prophet hides in a cave on Mt. Horeb. While hiding the prophet hears a strong wind, an earthquake and finally a fire. The prophet knew that God was not present in these powerful events. Elijah then hears God's voice in a tiny whispering sound. The scene reminds us that we are to open our hearts to hearing God.

The beauty of this story is that it also speaks about how we hear God in silence. Our first reading reminds us that we are also to pray in silence so that God can speak and communicate to us. In so doing our relationship with God may be strengthened.

A FAITH WHICH TAKES RISKS

Mother Theresa was a woman who constantly took leaps of faith. She was born in 1910 in Albania and grew up dreaming of becoming a missionary. In 1928 **she took a leap of faith** as she joined the Sisters of Loreto. In 1929 she arrived in India. On September 10, 1946, while traveling by train to the place of her annual retreat, God called her a second time. Now she was called to leave the convent, to live among the poor and to assist them.

She took a second leap of faith. In 1948 she left the Loreto Sisters and began her missionary work in the slums of Calcutta. In 1949 she was joined by 13 young women who were former students. In the first years she had no income and had to beg for food and supplies. She was tempted to go back to her former way of faith but believed that this was the life to which God was calling her.

During the last 50 years of her life, she experienced what has been called a Dark Night of the Soul. She did not experience the presence of God and it became difficult to pray. While she felt abandoned by God, she knew that God was with her. While it was difficult to pray, she at least sat in God's presence. In the midst of these trials her entire life was a leap of faith. She continued to do the charitable work for which she is famous as she knew that God had not abandoned her. Mother Theresa's life helps us to understand today's Gospel as Peter takes a leap of faith.

In today's Gospel the disciples are fighting a fierce storm on the Sea of Galilee early in the morning. During the storm, the disciples see Jesus walking across the sea, and in their fear, they believe he is a ghost. Jesus says to them, "Take Courage. It is I. Do not be afraid." (Matthew 14:27). In Hebrew, "It is I" is a title for God. Jesus is saying that he is God and that he does what God does. In the Old Testament God is shown as one who controls the chaos of the seas and who saves those who are in peril. In his power over nature, Matthew shows that Jesus is divine.

Peter stands on the side of the boat and asks Jesus if he can come to him. Jesus says "Come." Peter leaps out of the boat and begins to walk on the water toward Jesus. Soon Peter focuses on the storm and takes his eyes off of Jesus. Faith is keeping one's eyes on Jesus in the midst of the challenges of life. As he was sinking Peter cried out, "Lord, save me!" (Matt 14:30). Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him. In calling to Jesus Peter shows faith. The reading shows that Christ is always ready to save us as well.

May we, like Peter and Mother Theresa, be willing to take risks in following God. In our relationship of faith may we always stay focused on Christ.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Two Steps Forward . . .

Why did Jesus walk on water to the disciples in the boat? Did he want to scare them? No, his first words to them were "Do not be afraid." While they were being tossed by wind and waves, he showed them that he was not affected by the storm. If they had had faith, they might have realized that if Jesus was safe, they would be, too. We too must make that leap of faith, especially when we are afraid.

Our growth in faith is not a steady progression. For every two steps forward, we may take one step back. For example, we become ill or wreck the car, and think that God has abandoned us. But isn't that a natural reaction?

It is natural to doubt God in times of trouble, but we are choosing to live in the supernatural when we become followers of Christ. Like Peter, we can lose our focus on the Lord. We see someone we love who is gravely sick. We make a serious mistake that gets us in trouble. Faith tells us that though apparently invisible, God is more real than anything we can see. Remember Jesus on the cross saying, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" The Father never abandoned his Son and God will never abandon us. Tom Schmidt

Nineteenth Sunday in O.T. In this Gospel, Jesus immediately stretched out his hand and caught Peter, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Please help the Society of St. Vincent de Paul bring respite and hope to The elderly who are not able to find relief from the summer heat, and you will bring them faith and hope!

Hot! Hot! And we still have August heat! Many people lost their food when the electric went out for days and days. Red Cross sent many people to our little pantry! We never turn down anyone that needs food. We are a pantry with food and clothes, which is rare in our St. Vincent de Paul. We've had huge donations from "Labels" women wear. It's been a struggle removing the security tags on everything with only 2 removers. Mary Hernandez and Albert Butscher have been heroes for SVdP removing the tags. It is very time-consuming job but they didn't give up. In July SVdP fed 52 families, which included 44 children, 66 adults, 15 seniors, and 6 homeless. The cost of food was \$300.10 for 4,224 pounds of food. Joe Glorioso is doing a wonderful job keeping the pantry full. Cost of utilities was \$585.15. Janis Parker carefully vets the people in need. We still need a couple of people or small group to take over the clothing side. Come give it a try to see if this is your calling. God is calling your name.
