New Horizons-Epiphany 2024 by: Fr. Mark Watson, Pastor

As we journey though the Christmas Season, this weekend we celebrate the Epiphany. Epiphany refers to the ways that Christ manifests the glory of the invisible God.

The first reading helps us to understand the meaning of this Feast. The reading from the Book of Isaiah takes place as the exiles return from Exile in Babylon. God's splendor bursts forth for the returning exiles as Jerusalem rises up in splendor. A thick cloud covers the peoples of the other nations. Those of other nations are drawn to Israel. Jerusalem will light the way not only for its own inhabitants; it will provide a welcome refuge for people of all nations. All people from near and far come to the holy city, bearing their priceless gifts: riches from the sea, caravans of camels bulging with treasures, gold, frankincense and wealth beyond measure. God's salvation is not meant for Israel alone, instead it is meant for all people through Israel.

The Gospel tells the story of the Magi, who are Gentiles, or non-Jews, who seek the new born king of the Jews. The Magi pre-figure the faith of the Gentiles in Jesus Christ. This Gospel shows that the salvation of Jesus is offered to all people. There is a wonderful sense of mystery in this story. We are not told where the Magi are from, only that they are from the East. As they leave their homes, the Magi do not know where they will find the newborn king but still, they decide to undertake the journey. As they journey, God guides them. When the Magi find the Christ child, they prostrate themselves before him and they give him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Gentiles in Matthew's community would have been impressed by the Magi who show great faith in undertaking an arduous journey, by worshiping Jesus and by giving him valuable gifts.

The second reading is taken from the Book of Ephesians. In the early church there was a debate as to how Gentiles would become Christians. Many held that for Gentiles to become truly Christian they had to live the Jewish Law. The author of Ephesians states that through faith in Jesus Christ, Gentiles like Jews will inherit salvation. Thus, through faith Gentiles are members of the Body of Christ and are co-partners in the faith. The message of salvation is truly for people of every nation.


This Advent has led me to see that the meaning of the Epiphany is being lived out at our parishes. The Epiphany reminds us that the salvation of Christ is meant for all people and that Christ's light shines through all cultures. May all community members, of all cultures, find Christ's truth in one another's religious practices and devotions.

Our lives also are called to reflect the story of the Magi. Just as the Magi journeyed to find Christ, the ultimate destination of our lives is eternal life through Christ Jesus. As the Magi journeyed through the desert, they must have felt that God was far away. In our lives God at times seems far away. We are to continue on our journey knowing that God is with us in those most difficult times. Unlike the Magi, who encountered Christ at the end of their journey, we encounter Christ throughout our lives. This feast is not only about journeying to Christ and finding Christ in our lives but it is about Christ shining forth through our lives. We are to allow Christ to be made manifest through our love, our self-sacrifice and our sharing of the faith with others.
