New Horizons: The Lamb of God

We have just completed the Seasons of Advent in which we reflected on how the Lord came into the world at Christmas and how He will come in his final coming at the end of time. We have just celebrated the Season of Christmas in which we reflected on the meaning of the Incarnation and of His Manifestation to the Magi and through his Baptism. We look forward to the Season of Lent during which we will turn from sin and turn back to God as we prepare to celebrate Easter. We will than celebrate the Season of Easter during which we will reflect on the meaning of the Resurrection and the new life we received in Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

This Sunday we celebrate the beginning of Ordinary Time. What does Ordinary Time mean? The title of this Season does not mean that this time is ordinary. Ordinary Time is the time during which we reflect on the life and ministry of Jesus and in so doing experience how God desires to save us and to save the world.

In the first reading the boy Samuel is sleeping in the Temple at Shiloh. The first line of the chapter of our first reading states: "During the time young Samuel was minister to the Lord under Eli, a revelation of the Lord was uncommon and vision infrequent" (Samuel 3:1). It had been a long time since God had spoken to his people.

God calls to Samuel three different times while he is asleep and Samuel does not know it is the Lord. Each time he believes that Eli the priest has called him and so he goes to Eli. The first two times Eli believes Samuel is dreaming and so he tells him to go back to sleep. After the third time, Eli tells Samuel to say, "Speak Lord your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:10). This time God speaks to the boy Samuel and Samuel listens.

God begins to do something new in Israel. God punishes Eli and his sons who were being unfaithful to God and God begins a new time of grace through the prophet Samuel. The hour of the priest will now yield to the age of the prophet. This new age begins with Samuel and continues with Nathan, Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel.

We see God's holy time at work in today's Gospel. John the Baptist sees Jesus walking by and calls out to two of his disciples, "Behold the Lamb of God" (John 1:36). Two of John's followers listen and begin to follow Jesus. Jesus turns around and invites the disciples to "Come and you will see" (John 1:39). They follow Jesus and stay with him from about 4 pm until the end of the day.

The moment of grace flows from one invitation to the next. Andrew later goes out and brings Simon to Jesus. Jesus names Simon, Cephas or Peter. Just as God's grace broke into the world when Jesus invited the disciples to stay with him, so God's grace continues to break into our world.

The readings speak of God doing something new in Israel through Samuel and in the entire world through Jesus and his followers. Ordinary life is penetrated anew by the Word of God and the presence of God. May we be awake and ready to experience God's grace. These readings also call us to share the truth of the faith with others. Eli shares the truth of God with Samuel and John shares the truth with Andrew who shares the truth with Simon. Andrew then brings Simon to Jesus. Had Andrew not shared his faith with Peter, he might not have become the rock upon which the church was built. May we listen to and follow the Lord's call as did Samuel and share the truth of our faith with others as did Andrew.

Hello. God

Just before our first reading it says that "the word of the LORD was rare; there were not many visions." (1Sam 3:1) I imagine most people today would think that was true. Do you think God has stopped talking? People apparently felt that way in Samuel's time. Let's look at the reading to see what Samuel's experience can teach us.

At first Samuel thinks it is Eli calling him. It is not unusual for people to miss a sign from God. If you have a talent that you are proud of, perhaps it is a sign that God wants you to use that talent to help others. Or if a friend tells you she is concerned about your health, it could be God's way of telling you to get help. Try to see God speaking in whatever happens to you and you may hear a lot more than you think.

Samuel also gets help from Eli. Eli began to recognize that the LORD was speaking to Samuel. Sometimes we need help discerning what the Lord is telling us. A good spiritual director can help. He or she will probably ask how often you pray. In our reading Samuel finally speaks directly to God, instead of going back to Eli. So if you wonder what God plans for your life, try spending more time in prayer with him. I bet we have all had times where we didn't know if we are doing God's will because we didn't take time to pray. But don't do all the talking. Give God some quiet time to hear his response. For God hasn't stopped talking; we just stopped listening. Tom Schmidt
