

Gospel Reading

Matthew 16:13-20

Simon Peter acknowledges Jesus as the Christ and is given the key to the Kingdom of Heaven.



Background on the Gospel Reading

It is important to read today's Gospel and next week's Gospel as two parts of a single story. These readings are a turning point in Matthew's Gospel. This week we hear Jesus name Simon Peter as the rock upon which he will build his Church. Next week we will hear Jesus call this same Simon Peter "Satan" when he reacts negatively to Jesus' prediction about his passion and death.


In today's Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples what people are saying about his identity. The disciples indicate that most people believe that Jesus is a prophet of Israel. Then Jesus asks his disciples who they believe that he is. Simon Peter answers, identifying Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.

Jesus commends Simon Peter for this profession of faith, indicating that this insight has come from God. Because of Simon Peter's response, Jesus calls him the "rock" upon which Jesus will build the Church. This is a word play on the name Peter, which is the Greek word for "rock." Peter is then given special authority by Jesus, a symbolic key to the Kingdom of Heaven. Peter will play an important role in the early Christian community as a spokesperson and a leader.

In today's Gospel, Peter's recognition of Jesus' identity is credited to a revelation by God. This will contrast sharply with Jesus' rebuke of Peter in next week's Gospel. When Peter rejects Jesus' prediction of his passion and death, Peter is said to no longer be thinking as God does but as humans do.

The use of the term *church* in today's Gospel is one of only three such occurrences in Matthew's Gospel. Peter in this Gospel is being credited as the foundation for the Church, a privilege granted to him because of his recognition of Jesus' identity. The Church continues to be grounded in the faith that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Karen will be on vacation next week, so this will be a two-week bulletin. **Please note the two pre-registration links below for weekend Masses!**

This past week Bishop Fabbro announced all of the pastoral appointments for the diocese (the complete list elsewhere in the bulletin). Of note for our parishes was the official announcement of the activation of the Amherstburg-Harrow Catholic Family of Parishes effective September 1st, 2020. Another key announcement was the appointment of the Pastor for the Family. Bishop Fabbro has chosen to appoint me as the Pastor. Previously, I was only the Parish Administrator of both sites. The primary differences between Pastor and Parish Administrator are the scope and extent of authority in the parish (the Parish Administrator is more limited) and stability (a Pastor is appointed for a six year term versus a Parish Administrator who receives no term and can be reassigned at any time). I was very pleased for the appointment and the confidence the Bishop has in me to shepherd this faith Family. I look forward journeying with you to build a “mission-oriented Church forming disciples of Jesus” as our diocesan vision indicates.

Another big announcement this past week was the request by the seminary and the diocese to appoint a seminarian to our Family of Parishes for his pastoral year. They believe in myself, our pastoral team and staff, and you the parishioners, that we can be of help for this seminarian as he continues his journey of discernment and formation. It is a big responsibility for a parish leadership team and parish to take on such a mission, and I am confident that we will provide the environment, support, encouragement, and guidance that will be needed. We have had other seminarians in the past, and I have only heard good things about their experiences here. The seminarian we will be receiving is Matthew Sawyer. He will be with us from September until August. Final details are still being worked out so I will have further information in the future.

I am sure you can all recall the devastating explosion that occurred in Beirut at the beginning of August and all the destruction it caused. The people of Lebanon are in great need. Our Bishop (see letter below), is encouraging those who are able, to make a donation. Details are in the letter, but basically, make out a cheque to the parish, put it in an envelope marked with “Lebanon”, and place it in the collection basket at the door. We will forward all monies collected to Development and Peace to be distributed to those in need in the affected region. All donations made for this relief effort before August 24th are eligible to be matched. We are part of a global family and we have family members in need. Please help as you are able.

Another group in need is our annual support of the Hope of St. Joseph Shelter Inc. yard sale. As noted in this weeks’ bulletin announcement (see elsewhere in the bulletin), this year is very different. However, as we all know, the needs are still there for Fr. Donato and all the girls and children at the shelter who are housed, fed, clothed, educated, and counselled. Many of us are going through challenges at this time, but again, in whatever way you can help, it would be greatly appreciated.

Coming up in a couple of weeks will be the annual Mass at St. John the Baptist cemetery. As you may recall this is an open Mass, meaning anyone is invited to attend to remember their deceased loved ones, in particular those buried or interred there. It will be September 11th, 2020 at 6:00pm. Since it is outdoors, we are permitted to have up to one hundred people present. You must bring your own lawn chair and the wearing of masks is expected. Attendees must maintain physical distancing rules with those who are not part of your household or social circles. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we cannot move the celebration indoors, so if it rains the Mass will be cancelled this year. Although pre-registration is not necessary, it is helpful. If you would like to pre-register, please contact Kim 519-816-8154. If you have not pre-registered, registration will be necessary the day of the Mass.

Just a reminder, as I mentioned last week the numbers of those attending Mass each week continue to rise. As a result we are starting to find it more challenging to accommodate people who come to church without pre-registering. Merely showing up at the door may result in you and your family not being permitted to enter due to our capacity being met. Or we may have space for some of the family but not all. To avoid disappointment and to help Karen in the office with her weekly seating plan, it is very important to pre-register. Please remember, you need to pre-register to attend Mass every weekend you wish to come to Mass. Typically, pre-registration will open for the following week once pre-registration has closed for the previous week. As well, there is a new link for each week’s registration. So please click on the link below or go to our website www.ahcfop.ca and click on the link there. If you do not have access to online registration, you can register by calling 519-736-5418. If nobody is available to answer the phone, please leave a voicemail message at ext. 110 (Karen’s). Your message should include your name, phone number, the Mass you are registering for and the number of people you are registering. Registration will close at 2:30pm the Friday before the weekend in question.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Re: Emergency Relief Campaign for Lebanon

The terrible explosion on 4 August 2020 that devastated the city of Beirut is a major crisis for the people of Lebanon. They desperately need our prayers and support.

The three Christian hospitals close to the port, including the 600-bed St. George Hospital, have been severely damaged and evacuated. Consequently, Lebanon's health care facilities are overwhelmed.

I continue to be amazed by the generosity of the people of our diocese when disasters like this occur, and ask you to support emergency relief efforts for the people of Lebanon. Through collections that will be taken up in our parishes, we will work with the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace – Caritas Canada to ensure the funds collected are safely delivered. Development and Peace is working in collaboration with Caritas members in the region.

Donations made for this relief effort **before August 24th** are eligible to be matched. As a member of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, Development and Peace will be participating in a matching fund launched by the Canadian Government and the Humanitarian Coalition to help the people of Lebanon.

In the Diocese of London, funds are to be collected at the parish level.
