Gospel Reading



Matthew 5:1-12

Jesus teaches what it means to be happy.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Every year the Church recalls the example, witness, and prayer of the holy women and men who have been identified by the Church as Saints. These saints are more than just role models; they are family members with whom we continue to share relation, in a bond of prayer, called the Communion of Saints. Every year when we celebrate this day, the Gospel we proclaim recalls for us Jesus' teaching about happiness, the Beatitudes. We quickly note in this reading that none of those Jesus names as "blessed" or "happy" are expected . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness.

What does Jesus mean when he uses the word "blessed?" This word is sometimes translated as "happy" or "fortunate" or "favored." In other words, Jesus is saying that divine favor is upon those who are poor, who mourn, who are persecuted. This might have been welcome and surprising news to the crowds who heard Jesus that day.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Because of this, it is natural that we proclaim this Gospel on the Feast of All Saints. Saints are people who lived the spirit of the Beatitudes as Jesus lived. On this day, we too are challenged to model our lives on the spirit and promises of the Beatitudes.

Bill C-7

In this week's bulletin is a letter from Bishop Fabbro regarding Bill C-7. This Bill expands, in some very dangerous ways, the Euthanasia Law that we have in our country. Of particular note is the extension of the provision of euthanasia and assisted suicide to those who are not dying (which contradicts the original "purpose" of such practices to aid those with a chronic illness with no hope of recovery). We can see that our country is rapidly following the lead of other nations with euthanasia laws that increasingly dismiss the value of life. It is public record that the countries that have adopted some form of doctor-assisted suicide with "safe-guards" and "restrictions" still have 20% of those who are killed happening without the patient's consent. We can see that the courts and lawmakers in our nation are progressively accepting the fact that human life does not truly have any special dignity and can be treated like any other disposable product. We seem to have abandoned efforts to promote and expand palliative care, failing to increase its funding to appropriate and effective levels. Palliative care has overwhelmingly proven to help those with end of life issues and their families. A compassionate society is one that helps its members with their suffering at the end of their life (which we have the capability to do if we chose to). Rather than finding more and improved ways to care for our loved ones, we are expanding ways to kill them. Sadly, as evidence shows, assisted suicide will, over time, move from an "option", to a "suggestion", to an "expectation".

As well, we find that doctors and health care professionals who morally object to euthanasia and assisted-suicide are not protected by law to follow their conscience (a provision that has been given for other procedures). Those with disabilities and mental illness are also at greater risk with this law. "A 2019 government report said that people choose euthanasia because of fear of being a burden, loneliness, lack of support, or loss of dignity and meaning. People with disabilities face these issues daily. As a society we have a responsibility to support the vulnerable, not allow them to be permanently silenced." (Coalition for HealthCARE and Conscience). Please contact our member of parliament, Chris Lewis, and let him know your displeasure with the government's Bill (his contact info can be found at chrislewismp.ca). This was to assist them in their on-going outreach to youth in our area. We had an understanding that if they ever chose to leave that building, the parish would have the option to buy it back at the same price. Well, they have now moved into a new site at the community centre down the street and no longer need this building. As a result, as of Friday, we once again became the owners of that building and property. We do not see any practical purpose for the building ourselves, so we have placed it on the market and are hoping to sell it. Any interested buyers?

All Soul's Day (November 2nd) *** Monday, November 2, 2020 7pm Harrow***

All Saints (November 1st) is a celebration of the communion of saints, i.e. those people we believe are in heaven. November 2nd is now known as the "Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed". This day is a solemn celebration in our Church commemorating all of those who have died and are now in Purgatory, being cleansed of their venial sins and the temporal punishments for the mortal sins that they had confessed. They are being made pure before entering into the presence of God in Heaven and we can help them through our prayers. As a parish we will be celebrating a Mass for all of our deceased loved ones awaiting their entry into the heavenly banquet on Monday, November 2nd at 7:00pm at St. Anthony of Padua. Just as we only had one Mass for Thanksgiving at St. John the Baptist, we are only having one Mass this day as well.

Memorial Service for all those who have died during the past year

This year we are beginning a new tradition within our parish family as we will be having a Memorial Service for the families of all parishioners who have died during the past year. This will not be a Mass (we will be celebrating a Mass for all the deceased on All Soul's Day), but will be a liturgical service. This gives us greater freedom to honour and remember our deceased using various means – scripture, reflective music, a ritual of light, silence, audio visual aids, and so on. Other parishes have found that such a service is more inviting to families, especially since many of the grieving of today are not as familiar or comfortable with Mass. Mourning the loss of a loved one can be very hard and our hope is to help those who are grieving in whatever way we can. Taking advantage of the flexibility that a liturgical service can offer, other parishes have found it provided a better way for people to journey through their grief. Unfortunately, due to the COVID restrictions, we are limited to the number of people that can attend these services. To try to accommodate as many as possible, we are having three services (November 6th, 13th at St. John the Baptist and November 20th at St. Anthony of Padua). Invitations have been sent to the contact person of each parishioner who has died this past year. 

Pastoral Ministers Corner

This Monday November 2, the Church commemorates the souls of all the baptized who have died and who do not yet enjoy life with God in heaven, traditionally known as **All Soul's Day**. Few of us die with our souls completely purified from sin and imperfection. Our sins must first be burned away in the fire of God's merciful love in purgatory. It is the place of waiting and preparation where the soul is readied to enter heaven. Our Catholic faith teaches that these souls in purgatory can benefit from our prayers, alms, sacrifices, and Mass offerings. They advance in purification due to our prayers and offerings for them. This is why we pray for the dead and offer Masses for their advancement into heaven!

St. Gertrude was given a prayer by Jesus for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. It is piously believed that 1,000 souls are released from purgatory by praying this prayer with the heart.

Here is this powerful Prayer of St Gertrude the Great for the Souls in Purgatory:

Eternal Father, I offer You the most Precious Blood of Your Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for all sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

Matthew's Musings - All Saints





The Feast of All Saints, also known as All Hallows' Day, Hallowmas or All Saint's Day is a Feast day dedicated to all the Saints of the Church, the ones we celebrate daily and the ones we know nothing about. The Church has always taught that sainthood is paramount to attaining Heaven at the end of our earthly life. This feast is to commemorate all those that attained their perfect communion with God. In the early years of the Church the faithful celebrated the Martyrs on their day of Martyrdom, but as Christian Martyrdom began to increase, and the Church began to spread, a single day of commemoration was instituted. First instituted on May 13th according to Saint Ephraem Syrus in the 4th century, Pope Gregory III would include the rest of the Saints in the Feast of Martyrs when he dedicated a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica to the Saints on November 1 during his reign in the 8th century. In 837 AD Pope Gregory IV ordered the general observance of the Day going forward. All Hallows' Day and its vigil, what we know now as Halloween (all Hallows Eve) got its name from medieval English as October 31-November 2 became known as the Festival of All Hallows or All

To: The Faithful of the Diocese of London

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In a statement released 20 October 2020, the Catholic Bishops of Canada call on Catholics and all people of good will to make their voices heard in opposition to Bill C-7, which expands access to euthanasia and assisted suicide [\[link\]](#). This Bill removes, among other things, the requirement in the law that a person's death must be "reasonably foreseen" and extends the provision of euthanasia and assisted suicide to those who are not dying.

Catholic teaching upholds the inherent dignity of each and every person and affirms that it is gravely unjust to enact laws legalizing practices, such as euthanasia and assisted, that permit the taking of innocent human life.

The Bishops have been meeting with other religious leaders, disability advocates, physicians and legal professionals in order to address common concerns raised by Bill C-7. As a result of these meetings, there have been joint statements and individual statements issued by these groups opposing this Bill from different perspectives.

A joint ecumenical and interfaith statement endorsed by over 50 religious leaders across Canada maintains that the legalization of euthanasia is unacceptable for a civilized society [\[link\]](#). It warns that "doctors and other health-care professionals who, on basic religious or ethical principle, refuse to administer a lethal injection could be subject to sanctions, even to the point of losing their license." The religious leaders emphasize that we need to care for those who are ill and dying, not kill them. They point out that palliative care is not fully available and accessible. Making it available and accessible across Canada should be the approach of a truly just and compassionate society to suffering at the end of life, not the legalization of euthanasia.

The removal of safeguards by Bill C-7 would place vulnerable persons, those with disabilities and mental illness, in serious risk. The statement by disability advocates opposing this Bill has been endorsed by a broad group of disability advocates [\[link\]](#). I draw your attention as well to the statement of the group of physicians opposing Bill C-7, endorsed by 600 physicians across Canada [\[link\]](#), and to the statement of the group of legal professionals, endorsed by over 140 legal professionals and students [\[link\]](#).

I urge you, the faithful of our diocese, to contact your Member of Parliament. Join the Bishops, religious leaders and other concerned groups that are opposing Bill C-7.
