

Holy Week

This week we enter into the holiest time of the year.

Thursday will be our **Holy Thursday** celebration at 7:00 PM (St. Anthony of Padua). At this Mass, we celebrate the institution of the sacramental priesthood and the institution of the Eucharist. Rather than choosing representatives from the parish, during the Mass, each person will have the opportunity to have their feet washed commemorating Jesus' action at the Last Supper. This will be followed by a time of adoration in the "Chapel of Repose" until midnight.

We will have two **Good Friday** services. One service in the morning at 11:00 AM (St. Anthony of Padua) and the solemn service at 3:00 PM (St. John the Baptist). The morning service will be adapted so that it suits families and children better. The morning service will not have all the readings, the translation of the Passion we are reading will have easier language for children to understand, there will be adoration of the Cross and a modified praying of the solemn intercessions. Following liturgical norms, distribution of Holy Communion is not permitted at the morning service. The afternoon service will have all the readings, the usual translation of the Passion, adoration of the Cross, the full version of the solemn intercessions and distribution of Holy Communion. Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Drinking water, tea, juices, etc. do not constitute breaking the fast. As well, people are encouraged to take their normal medications.

The only Mass on Saturday will be **The Easter Vigil**, Saturday evening beginning at 8:30 PM (St. John the Baptist). This is THE celebration of our liturgical year. Although it is a lengthy celebration [probably 2 hours] its richness and meaning is unsurpassed. This year we are blessed to have four candidates who will receive their First Eucharist and Confirmation. Please note, there will not be any confession time Saturday morning.

Our **Easter Sunday** Masses will be at 9:00 AM (St. Anthony of Padua), 9:00 AM (St. John the Baptist), and 11:00 AM (St. John the Baptist).

Incense will be used at the end of the Holy Thursday Mass and during the Easter Vigil Mass, but will not be used at any of the other Triduum celebrations. Crowds will likely be larger than usual on Easter Sunday, so please be patient and welcoming to any visitors we may have.

Hymns Projected on Wall at St. Anthony of Padua

With our new music ministry at St. Anthony of Padua, we are using hymns from the CBWIII hymnal. We do not have enough copies to put in the pews, so we have decided to try to use the projection system. A new version of the CBW is supposed to be coming out so investing any funds in CBWIII or CBWII does not make sense at this time (besides the fact that resources for the CBWII are not readily available). Having the hymns projected allows us to choose a greater variety of music beyond the CBW series (if we wish) and it typically can increase participation of those at Mass. We found that the image from the projector was not visible from all parts of the nave of the church, so we had to lower it. In doing so, it required moving the statue of St. Anthony back to the alcove at the back of the church. This is a "work in progress", so we will try what we have set up and make necessary changes as we go forward. If you have any thoughts or suggestions, please let me know.


