

Sunday Reflection



Praying for someone who has hurt you is difficult. This prayer is especially powerful if you are still harboring some resentment. Pray from your heart. It is important to pray by name. So if possible, insert the name of the person who has hurt you where it says NAME.

(Pray for healing in your own heart.)

Loving Father, it is so difficult to let go of the hurt. First I ask you to cleanse my heart of my resentment towards NAME. Grant me the grace to forgive him/her for this pain I feel. Heal my brokenness and give me peace. I believe you have the power to do this. I trust in your justice.

(Pray for the person who has hurt you.)

I lift up NAME to you in prayer. I don't know what caused him/her to hurt me in this way. Only you can see what is in another person's heart. Please call to him/her and draw him/her closer to you. I know you have a tremendous love for all of your children, including NAME. In your compassion, grant him/her whatever grace he/she needs today. I ask this in the name of Jesus Christ my Lord, Through the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Tidbit of Information about the Importance of Hospitality

Recently, I spoke with a somebody who wanted to connect with the Church. During our conversation, I asked if they had ever been to our parish. They said, "yes, about six years ago, but I found it very cold." Initially presuming that they had come in the winter



and the heat was not high enough for them, I started to explain how a large church can be hard to heat. They smiled and then clarified that it had nothing to do with the temperature of the building but rather the "temperature" of the people. They had found their experience here unwelcoming and not warm and friendly. As a result, they did not feel like they were wanted by the community and chose not to return. Sadly, I have heard similar stories (not a lot, but still too many). That is why our ministry of hospitality is so important. That is why how we engage with the person sitting with us in the pew is so important. People are looking to feel the love of Jesus and they figure Church should be such a place. And it should be. I am pleased to share with you that those who have given our parish another "chance" over the last couple of years, have noted an improvement. And in fact, some of our new parishioners have registered in our Family of Parishes because of the hospitality they experienced. We are doing better! It takes all of us working together to achieve this.

Reminder about Ministers of Hospitality



The primary responsibilities of these ministers is to greet people at the door, help people who are unfamiliar with our church (washrooms, where to sit, etc.), gather the collection, and hand out bulletins at the end of Mass. The two key talents that are required: the ability to smile and to be warm and friendly. As well, you need to be at Mass a little early (20-30 minutes) and you have to stay a little longer at the end (5 minutes). We will be having an introduction/training

session for this ministry on March 6th at St. John the Baptist and March 11th at St. Anthony of Padua. The session begins at 6:30 and will go about an hour. Many of the basics are the same at each parish site, so it does not matter which session you attend (we will help you with the site-specific items after). Our hope is to have enough ministers so that you will only have to serve one weekend a month. This is an essential ministry for our community, so please consider joining this ministry if you are interested in the well-being and growth of our Family of Parishes. It would be helpful for our planning if you could let Sharon, our parish secretary, know you will be attending one of the sessions. If those dates do not work for you and you are interested in being part of this ministry let Sharon know. We are also asking for all current Ministers of Hospitality to attend this meeting as there are a few proposed changes that need to be discussed (please RSVP to Sharon).


