





Temporary Closing of St. Anthony of Padua

Beginning Monday, March 17th to Friday the 21st, St. Anthony of Padua Church will be "closed" for the installation of new carpeting in the nave of the church. This is happening due to the water damage that occurred two summers ago with the wind storm. Insurance is finally getting around to repairing the various areas of damage that occurred. Thus, all weekday Masses this coming week will be at St. John the Baptist (Tues. 5pm and Wed-Fri. at 9am). Stations will still be at St. Anthony's on Friday night (March 21). The meeting space can still be used by entering through the elevator door entrance.

The historical committee of St. John the Baptist has done an excellent job of preserving and advancing the history of our parish. Through their work, as noted in this week's bulletin, our 223 year history has been diligently cared for. The monies collected from our votive candle stands allow them to continue their work. I thank them for the many ways they are working to ensure our heritage is honoured.

Intentional Giving

I am very encouraged by the work of our Intentional Giving Committee (please see the article in this bulletin). One of Christ's key messages in the gospel is to look for those in need and share what you have with them. We are doing exactly that through this committee. We are sharing our financial resources, but equally important we are sharing who we are. Together our two communities are developing a relationship that helps us realize the fraternal bond we should have as brothers and sisters in Jesus' name regardless of our geographic location. In particular, I believe we are living the message of this Jubilee Year - together we are being pilgrims of hope!

Reminder about the Fundraising Opportunity

At the end of Summer last year, the air conditioning unit at St. Anthony's Church ceased operating. A new unit would cost approximately \$50,000. A Note from the Historical Committee



The Historical Committee of St. John the Baptist was established in January 1985 to collect, compile and preserve the History of the parish. Since that time, a small group of dedicated volunteers have taken on various missions. Our most recent is the restoration and shadowboxing

of the last stained glass centre medallion, ca. 1874, which was originally positioned on the north side of the crucifix in the sanctuary. This will be installed in the accessible entrance when completed.

It was through the Historical committee that in 2001 and 2009, the two votive candle stands were purchased for St. John the Baptist Parish. The committee continues to be responsible for their management. Funds from the lights have financed such items as the re-upholstery of church furniture, purchase of altar cloths, flooring, the St. John the Baptist statues, the repair of the rectory porch and assisted with building of the accessible entrance to name just a few projects.

On February 28, 2025, \$5000 in funds were transferred to the Church to be spent as needed. Other votive funds will be used for heritage projects. To designate a candle contact Anne St. Louis 519-736-0731 or Bonnie Deslippe 519-996-4085. The cost is \$200 for a year or \$100 for 6 months.

Intentional Giving Update



Thank you to everyone who participated in the Christmas card campaign to the parishioners of our sister parish of the Church of the Apostles in Faro, Yukon.

We sent over 70 Christmas cards, a number of Christmas CDs that the St. John the Baptist choir produced a few years back and a set of 5 beautiful children's books that were written and published by one of our parishioners, Christine Soulliere. Thank you Christine for donating the lovely books, which we hope will be shared by the children of the parish.

In a previous bulletin, we published pictures of the state of disrepair of the church in Faro. I am happy to report that the Diocese of Whitehorse is actively working on the Faro church project and they should be able to provide us with an update in the near future. Through the generosity of our Family of Parishes, we have recently been able to send \$7,940.00 from St. John the Baptist parish and \$1,410.00 from St. Anthony of Padua parish, to assist in the Faro church project. These monies come from a very small percentage of the weekly collections as well as donations made from individual parishioners for the Intentional Giving Program. The amounts set aside each week represent approximately 1% of the annual budgeted income for St. John's and less than two thirds of 1% of the budgeted income for St. Anthony of Padua. This small amount can go a long way in helping to support the Church of the Apostles in Faro.

God has given our family of parishes many blessings and we have much to be thankful for. Two years ago, we took a leap of faith and we decided to share some of those blessings with a parish that was in need, knowing that God would provide and trusting that our family would thrive. We have been able to send a total of \$17,650.00 to help rebuild the church in Faro and provide a safe place for the parishioners to worship. Please continue to pray for the parishioners of the Church of the Apostles.


