An Invitation to Adoration

What is a Holy Hour?

A Holy Hour is the adoration of Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist or Consecrated Host - the very presence of Our Lord!

The Eucharist is displayed in a special holder called a monstrance, and people come to pray and worship Jesus during the scheduled times.

You may spend a few minutes or sign up to be an "adorer" which allows you to schedule yourself for one or more hour per week to pray.

Value of a Holy Hour

The value of an hour spent before the Blessed Sacrament is beyond all that we can imagine. This time that you spend with Jesus is more precious than any other time.

Quote from Mother Teresa:

"The best act that we can perform at present, is to spend at least one hour each week before the exposed Blessed Sacrament."

And she added:

"You cannot be like Jesus unless you spend time with Jesus.

You cannot see Jesus in others unless you see Him in the Sacrament of Love"

What do you Actually do during a Holy Hour?

Recite your favourite prayers, read the bible, give thanks, pray in reparation, pray a rosary or any other type of prayerful devotion before Our Lord.

You can just sit and talk to Jesus about whatever is on your mind...or say nothing, simply keeping Him company, just as you would with a dear friend.
