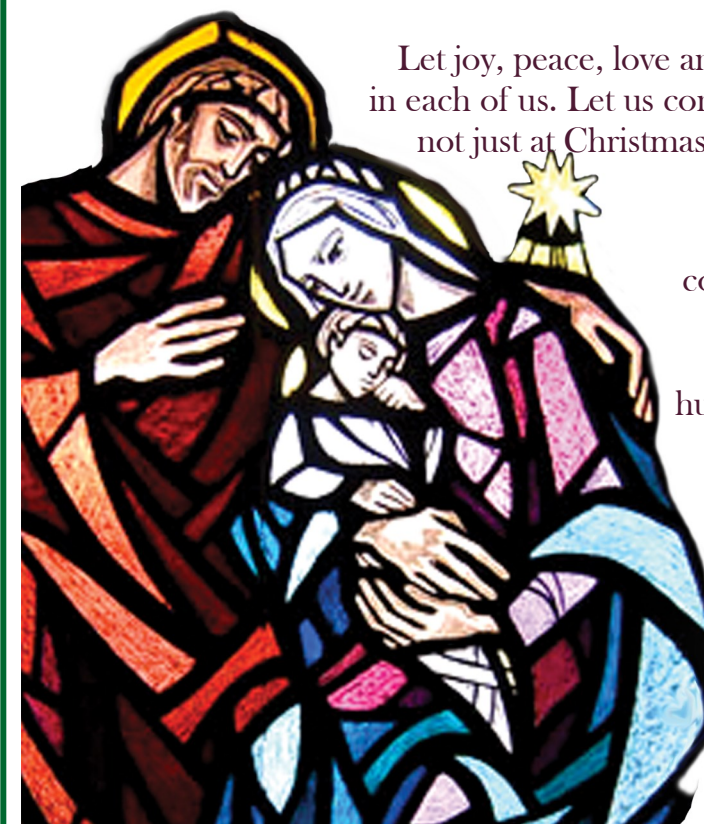

Gospel Lk 1:39-45

THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY (Lec.17)

Gospel Luke 2:41-52

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem,

but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. 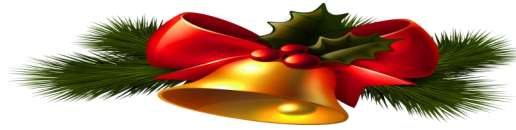

newborn king of the Jews? We saw
his star at its rising and have come
to do him homage.” When King Her-
od heard this, he was greatly trou-
bled, and all Jerusalem with him.
Assembling all the chief priests and
the scribes of the people, he in-
quired of them where the Christ was
to be born. They said to him, “In
Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has
been written through the prophet:
And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rul-
ers of Judah; since from you shall
come a ruler, who is to shepherd my
people Israel.” Then Herod called
the magi secretly and ascertained
from them the time of the star’s ap-
pearance. He sent them to Bethle-
hem and said, “Go and search dili-
gently for the child. When you have
found him, bring me word, that I too
may go and do him homage.” After
their audience with the king they set
out. And behold, the star that they
had seen at its rising preceded
them, until it came and stopped
over the place where the child was.
They were overjoyed at seeing the
star, and on entering the house
they saw the child with Mary his
mother. They prostrated them-
selves and did him homage.
Then they opened their treasures
and offered him gifts of gold, frank-
incense, and myrrh. And having
been warned in a dream not to re-
turn to Herod, they departed for
their country by another way.

What is a Jubilee Year?

What is an indulgence?

God never ceases to offer us his mercy. When we sin, an unhealthy attachment to earthly things remains even after the guilt of sin is forgiven. Such attachments can be purified here on earth through an indulgence or in purgatory; this purification is known as the remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1472).

How can I obtain an indulgence during the Jubilee?

During the Jubilee, a plenary indulgence—the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1471)—in the usual form of the Church will be granted to all the faithful who are truly repentant and detached from any sin, sacramentally confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and perform one of the following:

a pilgrimage visit to the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels or Mission Basil-

ica San Buenaventura to pray;

participation in a parish mission or study of the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church;

corporal or spiritual works of mercy; penitential practices.

How can I participate in the Jubilee?

The faithful from across the globe are encouraged to go on pilgrimage to Rome to pass through the holy doors of the major basilicas (an additional holy door will be opened at a Roman prison). Jesus says of himself, “I am the gate for the sheep ... Whoever enters through me will be saved” (John 10:7, 9). When pilgrims pass through a holy door with faith in him and the proper intentions, they receive grace from God. Unlike the Jubilee of Mercy, local Churches will not open holy doors during this Jubilee.

In the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, Archbishop José H. Gomez will celebrate the Rite of the Opening of the Jubilee Year on Sunday, December 29, 2024 at the 10 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels.

During this rite, the faithful will gather on the Cathedral Plaza to hear the word of God and the proclamation of the Holy Year, after which they will enter the cathedral in procession guided by a cross to be displayed in the cathedral sanctuary for veneration throughout the Jubilee Year; the cross to be displayed is the processional cross from the dedication of the cathedral.

To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise for ever. Amen.
