





## The Third Sunday of Ordinary Time



## "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

AVE YOU EVER WONDERED ABOUT Jesus' preaching, his sermons or homilies, and what he might have said? Well, wonder no more because today's Gospel from St. Luke gives us the first words, at least, of his first homily. We also have a glimpse of what first century synagogue worship may have looked like.

I had to go to, perhaps my favorite teacher today, Dr. Brant Pitre, to get the background information on first

century Jewish synagogue worship.

We must first understand that there was only one Temple, and that was the one in Jerusalem; we know that the people of that time were required to make a pilgrimage to the Temple three times a year (Passover, Pentecost, and the Day of Atonement), to offer sacrifice. Just as we have our priests today to offer sacrifice for us, and stand between us and God, so too did the first century lews. So we need to have an understanding that the priestly role was then and is now to offer sacrifice on behalf of God's people.

So what did they do all those other times to show Sabbath rest and offer Sabbath worship? That is how the synagogue system came into being. Obviously it was Jesus' practice to go to the synagogue on the Sabbath (Saturday, not Sunday). The practice was that it was not the priest who preached and taught in the synagogues, but rather it was the laymen of the community who did that. The priest were men who were descended from line of Levi, and we know that Jesus was from the line of Judah (from which David also came) and so we know he wasn't a priest in that sense. He was however a widely known and recognized

Rabbi, that is, a teacher of the Law. It's also interesting to note that the Pharisees we hear so much about in the Gospels were also laymen leading a lay movement. Pharisees were, for the most part, the leaders in the synagogues. This should also give us a deeper look into just why the Pharisees had so often bumped heads with Jesus; he challenged their comfortable authority.

Synagogue worship consisted of reading from the Torah—the first five books of Moses, the scrolls of the Law and another reading from the Hebrew scriptures, usually from the prophets. It was likely that Psalms were also sung, and this liturgical practice was followed by the Liturgy of the Banquet. Does this image bring to mind our own liturgical practice of the Sacrifice of the Mass in which we have the Liturgy of the Word, followed by the Liturgy of the Eucharist? Even though there was no sacrifice in synagogue worship, we can still see how our liturgical practices have come down to us after centuries of practice from our older brothers in the faith.

Jesus, as a Jew, used these synagogue liturgies, just as all first-century rabbis and men and women of faith did. In instituting the Eucharistic celebration at the Last Supper, he took elements of synagogue worship and Temple sacrifice and wedded them, initiating the liturgical practices that have come down to us through the New Covenant.

## Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it."

We will dig into more of Jesus' first homily in next week's column. Now I would like to turn briefly to our second reading from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians in which he expounds on the Mystical Body of Christ.

Saint Paul is the only New Testament writer who utilizes this image of the Mystical Body of Christ. This is the root of where all of theology finds its source in the imagery of the members of the Church making up the Mystical Body.

In brief, I would like to point out that this imagery from Paul illustrates the catholicity of the Church, as well as the diversity of its members. Mostly what Paul is writing about to this Christian community in Corinth is the idea that every person who is a member of the Church has been given a unique set of gifts from God, our Creator. Paul tells us by virtue of our baptism we have been given the Spirit of God. And the Holy Spirit builds up the Church through us by instilling within us His gifts. "And God has appointed in the Church, first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, then healers, helpers, administrators, speakers in various kinds of tongues." You, me, and every member of the Church has worth in the eyes of God, and a duty to continue the work of building up His Church.



It will be of great importance if you can leave aside your cares and spend the remainder of your life only in worshiping God. De requires no great matters of us; a little remembrance of him from time

to time; a little adoration; sometimes to pray for his grace, sometimes to offer him your sufferings, and sometimes to return him thanks for the favors he has given you, and still gives you, in the midst of your troubles . . . Lift up your heart to him, sometimes even at your meals, and when you are in company; the least little remem-



brance will always be acceptable to him. You need not cry very loud; he is nearer to us than we are aware of.



## † How does the Church understand the sacrament of Holy Orders?

The priests of the Old Covenant saw their duty as mediating between heavenly and earthly things, between God and his people. Since Christ is the "one mediator between God and men" (1 Tim 2:5), he perfected and ended that priesthood. After Christ there can be an ordained priesthood only in Christ, in Christ's sacrifice on the Cross, and through a calling and apostolic mission from Christ.

A Catholic priest who administers the sacraments acts not on the basis of his own power or moral perfection (which unfortunately he often lacks), but rather "in persona Christi". Through his ordination, the transforming, healing, saving power of Christ is grafted onto him. Because a priest has nothing of his own, he is above all a servant. The distinguishing characteristic of every authentic priest, therefore, is humble astonishment at his own vocation.

† What are the degrees of the sacrament of Holy Orders? The sacrament of Holy Orders has three degree: bishop (episcopate), priest (presbyterate), and deacon (deaconate). (YOUCAT questions 186-187)



#### 2021 ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL




