In addition to abuse, you must report any suspected criminal behavior by Church personnel to law enforcement and the diocese.

A Message from Msgr. Zach

Dear Friends,

A person's last words before he/she dies are often regarded as being particularly important and significant. Friends and relatives will sometimes go to great lengths to carry out the final wishes or instructions of the one who has left them. There may be directions as to how their funeral is to be conducted, or messages of love and appreciation for individuals who mattered to them.

Sometimes the dying person may ask for an apology to be made to someone they feel that they have offended but with whom, for some reason or other, they have had no chance to put things right. Once this is done, the individual feels that their life's business has been concluded and that they can, in truth, depart in peace.

Our Gospel for today brings the account of the earthly story of Jesus to its end by relating the tradition of what is, in Matthew's account, the one and only meeting of the risen Jesus with his remaining eleven male disciples in Galilee – he has previously appeared only to the women. Matthew follows Mark in depicting his male followers as deserting Jesus and returning to their home region of Galilee: perhaps they were thinking that thus they would avoid the fate that befell their Master. We might note that Jesus does not scold them for their behavior, but looks to the future and the part that they will play in the continuation of his mission and the spread of the Gospel. Jesus commissions these reconciled disciples for mission: they are to "make disciples of all the nations," and the sign that someone has accepted the message is that they will be baptized. Celebrating baptism, along with the Eucharist, means that we are declaring publicly that we are disciples of Jesus.

We might remember that at the beginning of Matthew's Gospel the annunciation of the birth of Jesus is made to Joseph by an angel, the messenger of God. The child to be born is to be given the name Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." This title does not occur in the Gospel again. But it's meaning returns in the final words of Jesus: "I am with you always; yes, to the end of time." The theme introduced by the angel at the beginning of the story is restated at the end: that God is with God's people, now in the person of the risen and glorified Jesus.

Jesus' ascension may suggest that he has departed from this world, and other parts of the New Testament refer to his coming again in glory at the end of time. Today's Gospel reading emphasizes that Jesus is still very much present with and among his disciples, as is shown in his symbolic name Emmanuel. In one of the accounts of the appearances of the risen Lord, he says to Mary Magdalene, "Do not touch me," which some scholars express as "Let me go!" Mary has just referred to Jesus as Rabboni," meaning "Master", or 'Teacher", which shows that she is thinking of him in the way she knew him before. The Gospel text is suggesting that she, and therefore we ourselves, should be prepared to imagine Jesus in a different way and relate to him accordingly.

Jesus has not left us: he is present to his disciples today, as he was to Mary Magdalene and the other disciples, though in a different way. His final words are addressed to us: that we should continue his work of revealing what God is like by the example of our lives. Most of us are not called to go elsewhere and make disciples, but we are called on to preach the

Gospel: this will not usually mean by what we say or do, but rather by the kind of person we are.
