

Pope Francis Prayer Intentions May 2025

For working conditions

Let us pray that through work, each person might find fulfillment, families might be sustained in dignity, and that society might be humanized.

A Message from Msgr. Zach

Dear Friends,

As we journey through the Easter season, the Church offers us today a powerful and intimate moment from the Gospel of John—a moment that captures the heart of Jesus' teaching and His call to discipleship. In John 13:31–35, Jesus speaks to His disciples not long after washing their feet and just before His betrayal. These verses are part of what is often called the "Farewell Discourse," a tender and profound teaching Jesus shares as His earthly mission nears its climax.

In this brief passage, we hear Jesus say, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in Him." At first glance, it seems paradoxical. Jesus speaks of being glorified in the very moment when Judas has gone out to betray Him. Yet, this is precisely how Jesus redefines glory—not as triumph in the eyes of the world, but as love poured out, even unto death. His impending crucifixion will not be a moment of shame but the ultimate revelation of God's love. In His Passion, Jesus glorifies the Father by revealing the depth of divine mercy, and the Father glorifies the Son by exalting Him through the Cross and Resurrection.

In this context of self-giving love, Jesus gives His disciples a "new commandment": "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." At first, this command may not seem new. After all, the command to love others is deeply rooted in Jewish tradition. What makes this commandment new is the standard Jesus sets—"as I have loved you." The love Jesus speaks of is not simply kindness or mutual respect, but a love that is sacrificial, enduring, forgiving, and unconditional.

Jesus' love was a love that served others, as He demonstrated by washing the disciples' feet. It was a love that healed the sick, welcomed the outcast, forgave sinners, and ultimately, gave His life on the cross. This is the love He calls His followers to embody. It is not a love based on convenience or comfort, but one that often requires great courage, humility, and perseverance.

In a world that can be marked by division, selfishness, and fear, the command to love as Christ loves is more relevant than ever. It is also one of the greatest challenges of Christian discipleship. Loving others in this way means choosing compassion over judgment, reconciliation over resentment, and service over self-interest. It means seeing Christ in every person—especially those we find difficult to love.

Jesus also tells His disciples, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." The witness of our love becomes the most convincing sign of the Gospel. The early Church grew not through eloquent preaching or powerful institutions, but because people were drawn to the radical, transforming love that Christians showed one another. That same call is ours today. Love is our mission, our identity, and our greatest testimony to the world.

As we reflect on this Gospel during the Easter season—a time of renewal and new life—let us ask ourselves how we are living out this "new commandment." Is our love for one another marked by the same depth and sincerity as Christ's love for us?




PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING-MAY 22™

St. Pope John I, Pope and Martyr-May 18

Pope John I was born in Tuscany, Italy, around the year 480. John was elected Pope while he was still an archdeacon upon the death of Pope Hormisdas in 523, during a time when the Western Roman Empire was in decline and the Church was facing numerous challenges. Despite these difficulties, Pope John I remained steadfast in his commitment to preserving the unity of the Church and promoting its mission. John was very frail when he was elected to the papacy.


At that time, the ruler of Italy was Theodoric the Goth who subscribed to the Arian brand of Christianity, but had tolerated and even favored his Catholic subjects during the early part of his reign. However, about the time of St. John's accession to the Papacy, Theodoric's policy underwent a drastic change due to in part by the severe edict against heretics enacted by the emperor Justin I, who was the first Catholic on the Byzantine throne in fifty years.

Spurred on by the appeals of Eastern Arians, Theodoric threatened to wage war against Justin but ultimately decided to negotiate with him through a delegation of five Bishops and four senators. At its head he named Pope John - much against the latter's wishes. John succeeded in persuading the Emperor to mitigate his treatment of the Arians and thus avoid reprisals against the Catholics in Italy.

However, Theodoric had been becoming more suspicious with each passing day. While waiting for the delegation to return, he ordered the execution of the philosopher Boethius and his father-in-law Symmachus on a charge of treason. As he got word of the friendly relations between the Pope and the emperor, he concluded that they were plotting against him. Hence, on the delegation's return to the capitol city of Ravenna, Pope John was imprisoned by order of Theodoric and died a short time later as a result of neglect and ill treatment. His body was transported to Rome and buried in the Basilica of St. Peter.

St. Pope John I is also remembered for his contributions to the liturgical and musical life of the Church. He is said to have composed several hymns and was a strong supporter of the use of Gregorian chant in the liturgy. Pope John I's love for the Church and his commitment to preserving its unity and promoting its mission continue to inspire Catholics to this day.

St.Pope John I was canonized by the Catholic Church in 872. Saint John I, Pope is the patron saint of priests.
