a Message from Msgr. Zach

Dear Friends,

Today, we gather to celebrate *Pentecost Sunday*—the glorious day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, filling them with divine power and purpose. Often called the "birthday of the Church," Pentecost marks the beginning of the disciples' mission to share the Gospel with the world. For families, it's a beautiful reminder of how the Holy Spirit unites us, empowers us, and calls us to grow in faith together.

In Acts 2, we read about the disciples gathered in one place when suddenly, a sound like a mighty wind filled the room. Tongues of fire appeared and rested on each of them, and they began to speak in different languages—declaring God's mighty works to people from every nation. Just as the Spirit brought unity among diverse people, He continues to bring unity to our homes and our church family.

Parents, grandparents, children, and teens all have a place in God's story. Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit speaks to *all*—young and old—and calls each of us to listen, respond, and serve.

The Holy Spirit doesn't just dwell in church walls or ancient stories; He is alive and active in our daily lives. Families can experience His presence in the small, quiet moments as well as the big celebrations. Whether you're helping a sibling, praying together at bedtime, or forgiving one another after a tough day, the Holy Spirit is there—guiding, comforting, and strengthening.

Encourage your children to look for the Holy Spirit this week: in acts of kindness, in nature, in the courage to do what's right. Ask each other, "Where did we see the Spirit today?" and celebrate those moments together.

Just as the disciples were filled with boldness to share the Gospel, we too are invited to be Spirit-filled witnesses in our communities. Let Pentecost Sunday be a time to reignite your family's faith. Talk about your spiritual journeys. Pray together for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit on your home, your neighbors, and the world.

You might even consider creating a small "Pentecost flame" craft with your children to place in your home—a symbol of God's living presence with you. Let it remind you all week that the same Spirit who empowered Peter to preach boldly is the same Spirit who gives us strength today.

Let this Pentecost be more than a date on the calendar. Let it be a spiritual spark in your family—a moment to pause, breathe in God's presence, and move forward with hearts ablaze for Him.




Father's Day Envelopes Available

St. Anthony of Padua-June 13

Saint Anthony was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal. He was born into a wealthy family and by the age of fifteen asked to be sent to the Abbey of Santa Cruz in Coimbra, the then capital of Portugal.

Following his ordination to the priesthood, he was responsible for the abbey's hospitality. When Franciscan friars settled a small hermitage outside Coimbra dedicated to Saint Anthony of Egypt, Fernando felt a longing to join them. Fernando eventually received permission to leave the Abbey so he could join the new Franciscan Order. When he was admitted, he changed his name to Anthony.

Some time later, Dominican friars came to visit the Franciscans and there was confusion over who would present the homily. It was then that the head of the Franciscan hermitage asked Anthony to speak on whatever the Holy Spirit told him to speak of.

Though he tried to object, Anthony delivered an eloquent and moving homily that impressed both groups. Soon, news of his eloquence reached Francis of Assisi.

In 1224, Francis entrusted his friars' pursuits of studies to Anthony. Anthony had a book of psalms that contained notes and comments to help when teaching students which he greatly valued.

When a novice decided to leave the hermitage, he stole Anthony's valuable book. When Anthony discovered it was missing, he prayed it would be found or returned to him. The thief *did* return the book and in an extra step returned to the Order as well.

So simple and resounding was his teaching of the Catholic Faith, the innocent could understand his messages. It is for this reason he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946.

Once, when St. Anthony of Padua attempted to preach the true Gospel of the Catholic Church to heretics who would not listen to him, he went out and preached his message to the fish. This was not for the instruction of the fish, but rather for the glory of God. When critics saw the fish begin to gather, they realized they should also listen to what Anthony had to say.

He was only 35-years-old when he died and was canonized one year later in 1232 by Pope Gregory IX. Upon exhumation some 336 years after his death, his body was found to be corrupted, yet his tongue was totally incorrupt, so perfect were the teachings that had been formed upon it.

St Anthony is venerated all over the world as the Patron Saint for lost articles, and is credited with many miracles involving lost people, lost things and even lost spiritual goods.
