Pope Leo Prayer Intentions June 2025

That the world might grow in compassion

Let us pray that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his Heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

A Message from Msgr. Zach

Dear Friends,

Perhaps one of the most well-known depictions of the Last Supper is that which Leonardo de Vinci painted as a fresco in the Church of Our Lady of Grace in Milan in Italy. It shows Jesus surrounded by his twelve apostles as he eats his final meal with them before he goes to the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem, is arrested and then put to death on Calvary. It is a poignant moment of communion and companionship – they literally "break bread" and share the bread and the cup of wine to express the union or bond of love and care that exists between them.

The Church has faithfully followed the command of Jesus thru the two thousand years that separate us from this Last Supper of Jesus with his apostles to our gathering today, as friends of Jesus who will do as he told us – in memory of him. Our temptation may be to understand "memory" in the sense of merely repeating words or actions that can appear a little old-fashioned or a simple repetition of past actions or events. This can seem at best a little "dry" and, at worst, irrelevant to my life today. This is not what we do when we gather for the Mass and "do this in memory" of Jesus. No, there is, here, Jesus' power and presence. Thru the working of the Holy Spirit, his suffering, death and resurrection affect, bless, and transform our lives today. Our own life becomes life-enhancing and life giving for the society and communities in which we are called to live out our baptismal vocation.

The origin of today's solemn feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is found in the night upon which he gave this precious gift to his Church – that is the night of the Last Supper: Holy Thursday. Because this falls within the great Triduum of Easter, the Church felt impelled to have a particular day upon which we should stop and reflect more deeply upon this gift of the Eucharist. So it was that, in 1264, Pope Urban IV extended this solemn celebration of Corpus Christi to the whole Church. A Dominican friar, Thomas Aquinas, wrote beautiful prayers and hymns to adorn this feast with imagery and devotion.

In our Gospel today, Jesus rejects the Apostles' idea that he should send the people away so that they can go and find something to eat themselves; in their eyes that was the best and most sensible thing to do. Not for Jesus. His concern is not only to TEACH the people but also to FEED them. He feels that need to care for both their physical and spiritual needs. This, down thru the centuries, has been part of the inspiration for the Church to be involved in social care and action as well to take the greatest care to celebrate the Mass and sacraments in a worthy and dignified way. Jesus takes the small gifts that we can offer (in the Gospel of today, the loaves and fish) and transforms them so that they can be enough to nourish and sustain a whole crowd of people!

Thru our baptism we are called to be people who continue the Lord Jesus' work of preaching the Good News and bringing healing and true nourishment to our world. Tradition has it that St. Francis of Assisi said to his followers: "Preach the Gospel at all times. Use words if necessary." We would do well to reflect upon how, today, you and I can preach the values and virtues of the Gospel. We do not always need words for others to understand how the Gospel message makes a difference in our lives, bringing a joy and a serenity that is truly healing and life-affirming.

St. Thomas More-June 22

Thomas More was born in London on February 7, 1478. He entered Oxford in 1492. Two years later, he left Oxford to become a lawyer and he trained in London until 1502 when he was finally approved to begin practice.

More also honed his skills as a theologian and a writer. Among his most famous works is "Utopia," about a fictional, idealistic island society. The work is widely regarded as part satire, part social commentary, part suggestion. Utopia is considered one of the greatest works of the late Renaissance.

From 1517 on, Henry VIII took a liking to Thomas More, and gave him posts of ever increasing responsibility. In 1529 More was made Lord Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster, which gave him authority over the northern portion of England on behalf of Henry.

During his tenure as Lord Chancellor, More prosecuted those accused of heresy and worked tirelessly to defend the Catholic faith in England. However, in 1530 Henry worked to obtain an annulment from his wife, Catherine. More refused to sign a letter to the Pope, requesting the annulment.

Henry was prepared to break away from the Church in Rome, something More knew he could not condone. In 1532, More found himself unable to work for Henry, whom he felt had lost his way as a Catholic. Faced with the prospect of being compelled to actively support Henry's schism with the Church, More offered his resignation, citing failing health.

In 1533, More refused to attend the coronation of Anne Boylen, who was now the Queen of England. More instead wrote a letter of congratulations. The letter, as opposed to his direct presence offended Henry greatly. The king viewed More's absence as an insult to his new queen and an undermining of his authority as head of the church and state.

Henry then had charges trumped up against More. On April 13, 1534, More was ordered to take an oath, acknowledging the legitimacies of Anne's position as queen, of Henry's annulment from Catherine, and the superior position of the King as head of the church. More accepted Henry's marriage to Anne, but refused to acknowledge Henry as head of the church, or his annulment from Catherine. This led to his arrest and imprisonment.

Despite a brilliant defense of himself and persuasive testimony, More was convicted in fifteen minutes. The court sentenced him to be hanged, drawn, and quartered, which was the traditional punishment for treason.

More was canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935. He is the patron saint of adopted children lawyers, civil servants, politicians, and difficult marriages.
