

Pope Leo Prayer Intentions July 2025

For formation in discernment

Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life, and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.

A Message from Msgr. Zach

Dear Friends,

In this Sunday's Gospel, we are invited into one of the most beloved parables Jesus ever told—the Parable of the Good Samaritan. It's a story that speaks to both the simplicity and the challenge of Christian love. A lawyer asks Jesus a profound question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus points him to the law: love God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind, and love your neighbor as yourself. But then comes the second question: "Who is my neighbor?" This is where Jesus responds with the parable. As a family, let us pause and reflect on the story Jesus tells. A man is attacked by robbers and left for dead. A priest and a Levite religious men—walk by without helping. It is a Samaritan, someone who would have been despised by the Jewish audience of Jesus' time, who shows true compassion. He stops, tends to the man's wounds, lifts him onto his own animal, and takes care of him.

This parable is more than a moral tale—it's a call to action. It challenges us to broaden our understanding of "neighbor" beyond the people we are comfortable with. For families, this message is both beautiful and difficult. It reminds us that our Christian calling is not just about attending Mass or saying prayers at home, but also about how we treat those around us, especially those in need.

In the family setting, we can begin living this parable in small but powerful ways: **By teaching our children empathy**—helping them recognize when someone is hurt, left out, or in need.

By modeling generosity—whether it's helping a neighbor with yard work, donating to a local food pantry, or simply offering a kind word to someone going through a tough time. **By being present to each other**—in our homes, sometimes the person needing help may be right across the dinner table, silently carrying emotional or spiritual wounds.

It's easy to walk past the needs around us when we're busy or preoccupied. This week, let's talk together as a family about who our "neighbors" are. Who might be hurting in our community, school, or parish? Who is lonely, struggling, or feeling forgotten? Let us not allow our differences—race, language, status, or opinions—to become excuses for inaction. As Pope Francis often reminds us, we are called to build a culture of encounter.

And let's not forget that sometimes *we* are the ones lying by the roadside, in need of care. May we have the humility to receive love and kindness, and the courage to extend it in return. May our homes become places where mercy is practiced, where kindness flows naturally, and where the question "Who is my neighbor?" is answered not just in words, but in the way we live our lives—every day. **"Go and do likewise."**

St. Kateri Tekakwitha - July 14

St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was born in 1656, in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. Her mother was an Algonquin, who was captured by the Mohawks and who took a Mohawk chief for her husband.

She contracted smallpox as a four-year-old child which scarred her skin. The scars were a source of humiliation in her youth. She was commonly seen wearing a blanket to hide her face. Worse, her entire family died during the outbreak. Kateri Tekakwitha was subsequently raised by her uncle, who was the chief of a Mohawk clan.

Kateri was known as a skilled worker, who was diligent and patient. However, she refused to marry. When her adoptive parents proposed a suitor to her, she refused to entertain the proposal. They punished her by giving her more work to do, but she did not give in. Instead, she remained quiet and diligent. Eventually they were forced to relent and accept that she had no interest in marriage.

At age 19, Kateri Tekakwitha converted to Catholicism, taking a vow of chastity and pledging to marry only Jesus Christ. Her decision was very unpopular with her adoptive parents and their neighbors. Some of her neighbors started rumors of sorcery. To avoid persecution, she traveled to a Christian native community south of Montreal.

According to legend, Kateri was very devout and would put thorns on her sleeping mat. She often prayed for the conversion of her fellow Mohawks. According to the Jesuit missionaries that served the community where Kateri lived, she often fasted and when she would eat, she would taint her food to diminish its flavor. On at least one occasion, she burned herself. Such self-mortification was common among the Mohawk.

Kateri was very devout and was known for her steadfast devotion. She was also very sickly. Her practices of self-mortification and denial may not have helped her health. Sadly, just five years after her conversion to Catholicism, she became ill and passed away at age 24, on April 17, 1680.

Her name, Kateri, is the Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena. St. Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct. 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans.
