Helping the Brokenhearted

Much ink has been used, many hours on TV specials and radio commentators are exhausted. DOING WHAT? Offering evaluations of the "non-normal" life that every American (except cribbed babies) has experienced in the last year or so. They want to help all of us in difficult moments when "normalcy" was as foreign as the complicated languages in the world. Let me offer you a man, few have known, who would probably die a second time if he came from his grave, were that possible. The man was a king who spent hours in prayer, with days of writing and time in the Temple. I speak of King Davis who composed 150 documents we might call poems, songs, letters or notes. He called them The Psalms! This man knew Yahweh well. He knew from personal experience what "non normal" happened to be. His Psalms did not have to confront a death-dealing virus. What he saw were the prices so many believers paid where believers did not spend their lives in most horrible prisons. In early Old Testament these individuals were beheaded or fed to lions, even as early as Roman times. Even today martyrs total astronomically outrageous numbers in different parts of what we call modern times. We might ask how these folks dealt with terrible fates. The King of the Psalms wrote these words in Psalm 34:19 -- "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted; and those who are crushed in spirit he saves." My friends, we are no different in our pandemic days, weeks, months and never stopping years. Are there any of us who have not suffered pains, of so many new and previously unexpected difficulties that even take lives? You know we do not, in our land, suffer persecutions. We ache in so many bodily and emotional ways from losses, illnesses, misunderstandings, loss of employment, loss of personal financial treasury, dealing with young adults with serious lack of emotional stability, etc., etc., etc., etc., loneliness and serious fears deep in hearts. How many of our contemporaries have remembered to turn to the Lord, to the Bible, to the Book of Psalms? We have to remember what we have just celebrated, the Resurrection which is a true source of sustaining in difficult times. I believe many do not turn to Jesus Christ every day in these terrible days. So many ask, "Where is God in all this mess? Do we take a Psalm like this one noted above, Psalm 34, and in prayer and reflection, sucking every ounce of conviction from David's promises that the Jesus we celebrated on Easter Sunday has not walked away from us. Do we seriously open almost hourly colloquies with the risen Jesus, depending on Him as a personal guide and on what He promised so often in His lifetime: "I am with you always!" What word is it that drives doubters away? He guides and holds us in His Love. Yes, He is always there for you. We simply have to trust and to ask, "Lord, come to me. I need vou now, so much."



New Film Explores Contributions of Native American Catholicism

Enduring Faith: The Story of Native American Catholicism to air on ABC affiliated stations

NEW HAVEN, Conn. – A new documentary produced by the Knights of Columbus on Native American Catholicism will air on ABC affiliated stations through a partnership with the Interfaith Broadcasting Commission (IBC) beginning May 16, 2021.

Enduring Faith: The Story of Native American Catholicism explores the rich contribution and witness that Native American Catholics have given to the faith over the course of nearly 500 years.

"The history and deeply ingrained traditions of Native American Catholics demonstrate how Christ reveals himself through the uniqueness of every culture," Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly said. "Our hope is that this film will inspire a greater appreciation of the faithful witness of Native American Catholics."

The documentary begins in the 16th century, when Mary, under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, appeared to St. Juan Diego as a mestiza woman. The film goes on to explore the life of St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first canonized Native American saint, and the 20th-century Lakota healer, Nicholas Black Elk, whose cause for canonization is currently open in Rome.

The film examines the spiritual and cultural gifts of Native American Catholics, the wrongs inflicted upon them by the often unjust policies of the British and American governments, and how Native American Catholics today continue to live out their faith in fully inculturated ways.

The documentary is part of the Knights of Columbus Native Solidarity initiative. First announced at the 137th Supreme Convention in 2019, the Native Solidarity initiative began with a partnership between the Knights, the Diocese of Gallup, N.M., and the Southwest Indian Foundation to build a shrine to St. Kateri in the Southwest United States. As the Covid-19 pandemic struck, as part of Native Solidarity and the Order's "Leave No Neighbor Behind", Knights brought necessities to thousands of native and indigenous communities in New Mexico, Arizona, Utah, and Hawaii that were struck particularly hard by the Covid-19 pandemic. The Knights has also collaborated with Life is Sacred, a native-run non-profit committed to building a culture of life and a civilization of love, and the Black and Indian Mission Office.

Enduring Faith: The Story of Native American Catholicism will air primarily on Sundays. To find air times for your area, visit kofc.org/enduringfaith.


