## A time to prepare

Welcome to Lent! On Ash Wednesday, some of us have the custom of wishing one another a "good Lent." Why good? Should not we be wishing one another a solemn or serious or remorseful Lent? Maybe we should, but it is entirely appropriate to extend this good wish to others. Lent is good. It is good because it focuses us on what is most important. Every year Lent invites us to prepare for the celebration of the great high feast of Easter. It calls us to join ourselves more closely to the main event of our faith: the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus.
"Return to me with your whole heart": In other words, repent. Turn back to God. One of the things that gives Lent such power is hearing once again the voice of God calling us back, a voice filled with patience, love, and mercy. With regret but also with joy we realize that voice has always been speaking to us, though we have not always listened.
So we gather to make our prayer for mercy and give thanks for God's unfailing compassion. We receive a mark on our foreheads as a sign of an inner change of heart and mind that will express itself in our attitudes and what we do.

One way Lent draws us anew into Christ's sacrificial and reconciling love is through practices: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These practices-all mentioned in the scripture readings for Ash Wednesday-are ways to show ourselves we are keeping the season.

But please do not get caught up in mere observance. Let us not forget that one of the things Jesus did was to overturn an outward, rules-oriented path to holiness.

Pray, fast, and give alms with humility, not to impress others or ourselves, but with the intention to purify ourselves, serve others, and give glory to God.

Anything we do to turn toward God is prayer. Lent aims to make prayer more a part of our lives, both by praying more regularly and deepening our experience of prayer.
One place to start: Pray every day, in whatever way suits you. Catholic tradition offers a wealth of ways to pray: morning and evening prayers, meal time prayers, prayerful reading of scripture, devotions, the liturgy, spiritual reading, prayer groups, retreats, and even now prayer resources on the internet. Lent gives us the chance not only to pray more but also to become more prayerful, to make our entire lives a prayer.

Fasting: What we do with food is an outward sign of what we do with ourselves. The official days of fasting and abstinence serve as reminders of the deeper meaning of fasting: to see and then try to remove all that separates us from the love of God and neighbor. The hallowed Catholic custom of giving something up for Lent is, as well, a form of fasting.

That leaves almsgiving. Sure, one way to give alms is to open your checkbook more often for the great number of worthy causes in need of funds. The larger spirit of alms, though, is one of generosity-which can take many forms. The Easter mysteries celebrate Jesus' giving of himself for the sake of the world. In imitation of him, give more of yourself, your time, and your energy, especially with those who most need your help.
The practices of Lent are just that: practices. We do them to get better at them. But they are not ends in themselves. Lent is not the end; Easter is. Death and loss are not the end; Welcome to Lent! It is a blessed time. In it we draw closer to our Lord, and we learn to pray more deeply, remove the obstacles in our lives to love, and give of ourselves more generously. What could be better than that? Have a good one.

## 'In Solidarity with Ukraine'

Knights of Columbus relief efforts in war-torn Ukraine chronicled in new documentary airing on ABC affiliates nationwide beginning Feb. 26


The Knights of Columbus' ongoing relief efforts for internally displaced persons and refugees are chronicled in the new Knights of Columbus-produced documentary "In Solidarity with Ukraine." The 60-minute documentary will premiere on Feb. 26, 2023, for a six-week run on ABC-affiliated stations across the country through a partnership with the Interfaith Broadcasting Commission.
"Our message to internally displaced persons in Ukraine and refugees in Poland is one of solidarity, gratitude and a commitment of continued support," said Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly. "Knights in Poland and Ukraine are committed to meeting the long-term needs of the people and communities most impacted by this devastating conflict. This is why I can say with confidence to the Ukrainians: 'You're not alone.' This is why I can promise we'll be there for as long as it takes."

The Knights responded within 36 hours of the Russian invasion by committing $\$ 1.5$ million toward humanitarian relief and established the Ukraine Solidarity Fund. To date, the Knights of Columbus has raised more than $\$ 20$ million, and thanks to the more than 9,000 Knights in Poland and Ukraine, distributed over 3.2 million pounds of food to those affected by the war. During the first weeks of the war, the Knights of Columbus Mercy Centers provided muchneeded opportunities for refugees to find shelter, warmth, rest, food and water - as well as spiritual support through the presence of Knights chaplains and the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy.

"In Solidarity with Ukraine" was produced by David Naglieri, director of film and digital media for the Knights of Columbus, and features commentary from Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly; Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, supreme chaplain of the Knights of Columbus; Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church; Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, dictionary of the service of charity; Archbishop Mieczyslaw Mokrzycki of Lviv; and Scythian, a Celtic folk-music band founded by brothers Alexander and Danylo Fedoryka, who are firstgeneration sons of Ukrainian immigrants.
