# **IMPORTANT CALENDAR CHANGE**



The Wednesday before Thanksgiving, November 24 was scheduled to be a Noon dismissal day. The Superintendent for Catholic Schools, Mrs. Branaman has directed principals to grant teachers an extra day off in recognition of the tremendous effort that our teachers are putting forth to keep children engaged, safe and acclimated to being back in school. As you know, St. Matthias has had its own staffing challenges with the resignation of the first grade teacher in September, the PE teacher in October and a

shortage of people to cover these positions. We are still looking for a part time art teacher for grades 4-8. It is nearly impossible to find substitute teachers and parent volunteers for lunch and recess are also very rare. Until just recently, teachers were cleaning and sanitizing the 26 tables in the lunchroom at the end of an 8 hour day that still demands evening time to plan, grade and answer parent emails. We are very grateful to the early car line parents who now help out with this. Per Superintendent's Branaman's directive, school will now be closed on November 24. The half day will be moved to later in the year.




#### RAFFLE TICKETS

# DO YOU WANT YOUR CHILD TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENTS?

Children who are in second grade and have attended either a Catholic school or parish religious education program last year are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the spring. School families will receive an information folder next week with further details.

Catholic students in 8th grade will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in May. Students who are not yet enrolled in the Confirmation program, must contact Mr. Saverino.

If your child is in grades 3-8 and has not received First Holy Communion, but is baptized in the Catholic faith, please contact the school office to arrange for sacramental preparation.
