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## THE ABUNDANCE OF GOD'S LOVE

The crowd that followed Jesus to the deserted place was fed, body and spirit. Jesus wanted them to know that in his presence they would find care and compassion. He would not let them go hungry. Like Abram who encountered God in the bread and wine offered by Melchizedek, they experienced first-hand the abundance of God's love. These sacred meals prefigured the meal most profound, the supper shared by Jesus and his disciples on the night before he died, the feast in which we share in the Eucharist. Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On this day, we appreciate anew the great love of Jesus Christ for us and for the world and experience first-hand the presence of Christ in the sacred meal.

## TAKEN, BLESSED, BROKEN, SHARED

We do it so often, we could take it for granted. Yet, the mystery of the Eucharist, our participation in, reception of, and being sent to live as Christ's Body and Blood is a gift beyond measure. In the desert with the crowd and on the night of the Last Supper, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, said a prayer of blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to those who hungered for physical and spiritual nourishment. Scripture scholars and theologians often remind us that we are to repeat Jesus' actions of taking, blessing, breaking, and giving—with our lives, resources, and gifts—so that others may know the love of Christ. As Eucharistic people, we are meant to be changed, to become more like the One whom we receive.

## GIVE THEM SOME FOOD YOURSELVES

Notice that Jesus sent his disciples to give the crowd the food they needed. Jesus could have done this alone. We could say he didn't need the disciples to participate in the feeding of the great crowd. But Jesus did not act alone then, and Christ relies on us now, to feed those who hunger and thirst physically, spiritually, and emotionally. When we grow weary and want nothing more than to satisfy our selfish and self-centered impulses, it is good for us to remember who we are and whose we are. It is crucial that we hear in the depths of our hearts, "Give them some food yourselves," and be ready to do so. On this solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us celebrate Christ's living presence with and for us and recognize our call to share that presence with others.

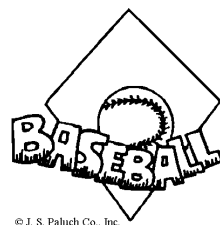
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## Parish & Catholic Community Happenings

### **HOLY HOUR TO BRING OTHERS BACK TO CHURCH**

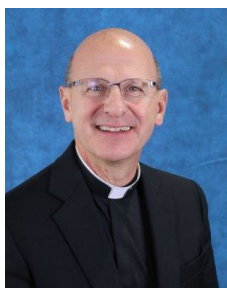

### **The Feast of Corpus Christi - Why is the Eucharist so important to the Church?**

The Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's life, or in the language of the Catholic Catechism, "It is the Source and Summit of our Christian life." If the statement above seems a bit vague to sink your teeth into, please consider

this—that after 2000 years our Catholic faith has continued to hold this sacrament up as the greatest and most important gift God has given to the Church to keep us united. It is the one sacrament that keeps Catholics from fragmenting into hundreds of denominations.

Have you ever recognized that even the Bible cannot stop Christian denominations from dividing amongst themselves? Hundreds of denominations have begun and then split apart over different interpretations from the one bible, which is supposed be the sole source of authority to unite them. Not so.

Sure, who doesn't wonder at the mystery that bread and wine actually become the body and the blood, the soul and divinity of Jesus Christ, and yet, here we are 2000 years later—Catholics rallying around altars spanning the planet, all united in our faith and worship of Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who gave His flesh for the life of the world.

The Church's constant teaching, that the inner substance of the bread and wine become the real body and blood of Jesus, is not a man made doctrine. An honest and true study of everything Christ said about giving us His flesh to eat and His blood to drink, and all the biblical foreshadowing of what God intended to give us in the Eucharist, has been presented through the past 2000 years, it is all there.

In the Eucharist, the very passion, death, and resurrection Jesus underwent is made present again in the here and now. How? By the power that what happened on Calvary 2000 years ago transcends time; that is to say God is beyond the limitations of the time and space. You and I are bound up by time and space on this planet, but not God. Hence, Christ's one sacrifice 2000 years ago is made present at every Mass in every age, and in every place. The term "holy sacrifice" of the Mass is exact because sacramentally the death and resurrection of Jesus is once again made present.

**The Eucharist is in fact what keeps us united on the visible level of the one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church, but the Eucharist also keeps us united in the inner life of the Spirit, the inner life of love.** Consider how God created us in His image as

man and woman—no longer two but one flesh. It is the inner dynamic of the thing we call love that brings a man and woman into one accord, a unity of oneness. So it is with the inner life of the Eucharist—it is Jesus Christ and the very gift of Himself, His love, given to us in the Eucharist, that in fact helps to bring about the unity of oneness, the inner dynamic of love.

**Prayer Before the Blessed Sacrament.** Lord, Jesus, as I kneel before Your hidden presence, help me respond to Your graces so that I may be as really present to You, as You are to me, in the most Blessed Sacrament of Your love and mercy. Allow your radiant presence to re-ignite the fire of Your Spirit within me, so that I may be Your Sacrament of love and mercy and all. Amen.

## Catholic Community Happenings



**EUCCHARISTIC FAITH** In Bolsena, Italy in 1263, a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He is described as being a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated host. While celebrating Mass, blood from the consecrated host started to trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal (the small square cloth in the middle of the altar upon which the chalice and sacred vessels are set for consecration). The

priest immediately attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, where Pope Urban IV was then residing. The Pope listened to the priest's account and sent emissaries to conduct an investigation. When all the facts had been determined, he ordered the bishop of the diocese to bring the host and the linen cloth with the stains of blood to Orvieto. The Pope met the procession, and amid great pomp had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still on display in the cathedral of Orvieto. This miracle is among hundreds of recorded Eucharistic Miracles throughout the history of the Church and prompted the Church to add Corpus Christi Solemnity to the Calendar. 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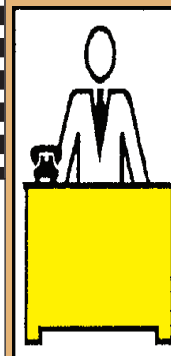
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
