- * Luke also wrote the Acts of the Apostles. His gospel is the story of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem to the cross and resurrection. Acts is the story of the gospel spreading from Jerusalem to 'all the nations'. A unifying theme in Luke is that of 'journey'.

INDOOR SERVICES:

The guideline for indoor religious gathering must apply the 1 person per 2 square metre rule.
Maximum number: 124 people plus 1 Faith Leader.
The square metre rule doesn't include babies under 12 months of age.

QR Code will be required for signing in to Weekday Masses upon arrival.

WEEKEND MASSES

REGISTRATION: Complete online with name & phone number. **NB.** Please enter one name per Option and select the first option that comes up

CHECKING IN PROCEDURES TO MASS

Step 1—Please have your name ticked off first

Step 2—Proceed to check in at one of the QR check-in stations or if unable to self QR check in, please proceed to one of the volunteers

SANITISING: Sanitise hands before entering into the church and sanitise hands at a dispensing station before coming to communion

FACE MASK: Fitted face coverings in church are no longer mandatory unless a distance of 1.5m cannot be maintained.

All people must carry a face covering. Please also be respectful of those who want to wear their mask.

COMMUNION: in the HAND ONLY

PHYSICAL DISTANCING: 1.5m at all times

ENTRANCE DOORS: will be locked at the start of Mass. **(Please be on time)**

NEWSLETTERS: Please take it home with you

COLLECTIONS: at the end of mass and can be placed on your way out into the marked collection boxes by the Exit door to the church foyer

CLEANING: in the church has to take place before and after mass. **After mass has ended, please exit to the outside before you begin your conversations so the volunteers can clean the church.**

If you are unwell and have symptoms of Covid-19, please get tested and stay at home.
