

# PARISH MASSES IN THE CHURCH **COVID-19 GUIDLELINES**

**UPDATED: 23RD JUNE 2021** 

#### **INDOOR SERVICES:**

The numbers for our indoor masses with the density quotient of 1 per 4 sqm: Maximum of 90 people (numbers includes celebrant)

**REGISTRATION is ESSENTIAL:** Complete online with names, phone numbers and QR Code upon arrival

**SANITISING:** Entering into the church **and** prior to receiving communion

### **FACE COVERINGS:**

Must be carried at all times and be worn indoors except during reading and reception of Communion Face coverings is recommenced to be worn outdoors where 1.5 metres physical distancing cannot be maintained

#### SINGING

Singing is permitted under certain conditions: - face coverings must be worn by the

congregation when singing indoors at all times.

- Face coverings must be worn by cantors or choirs indoors. They may be removed during the period of singing but must be replaced and worn otherwise. Further recommendations when singing can take place include:
- Singing outside, or in a well-ventilated room (with windows open);
  - Physical distancing of at least 2 metres between each person while singing;
  - Short performances (of less than an hour); - Singing softly
    - Fans, free standing or ceiling, are not recommended for use in enclosed indoor spaces for singing.
- Performers should be 5 meters from the audience where practical.

**COMMUNION:** in the HAND ONLY

PHYSICAL DISTANCING: 1.5m at all times

ENTRANCE DOORS: will be locked at the start of Mass

If you are unwell and have the following symptoms: fever or Covid-19 symptoms, please get tested and stay at home

Thank you for your cooperation with the restrictions and guidelines that are in place.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Points of interest and Catholic lore

- \* There is great debate about the relationship of 'the brothers of the Lord' to Jesus. Some scholars suggest that they were in fact literal brothers (or halfbrothers or step-brothers), while other scholars point out that it was common practice to refer to cousins and even more distant relations as 'brothers'. The Catholic Church holds that Jesus was the only child of Mary, the virgin mother of Christ.
- The reference to Jesus as 'son of Mary' was a slur on his legitimacy because, in Jesus' time, people were usually identified as the child of their father.
- \* The man referred to here as 'James, the brother of the Lord' later became the leader of the Church in lerusalem.

### FIRST READING: Ezekiel 2:2-5

A reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel.

The heavens were opened, and I saw visions of God. When I saw this, I fell on my face, and I heard the voice of someone speaking. A reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

Considering the exceptional character of the revelations, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me. "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses. so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.
