The Victorian Government has recently announced a mandatory vaccination requirement for all authorised workers (this includes volunteers assisting livestream Mass and those visiting homes on the Bread Round). Guidelines state that as of:

15 October 2021 – all authorised workers will require their first COVID-19 vaccine dose.

26 November 2021 – all authorised workers will be required to be fully vaccinated (two doses)

To be rostered from 15 October and beyond, it will be necessary to provide a copy of your vaccination certificate to the Parish Office.

This is not an easy issue to navigate, and the Archdiocese will continue to monitor and communicate any updates to government requirements. I request that all concerned follow the guidelines as stipulated.

PANIS ANGELICUS a Listener's Request by David Wood

Recently a listener requested me to include the hymn *Panis Angelicus* in one of my radio programmes. I have several versions of the hymn and although I play one to air fairly regularly, this was the first time I had received a request for the hymn.

The translation from Latin is, "Bread of Angels" or "Angelic Bread". Saint Thomas Aquinas included the Latin words in a 13th century hymn written for the feast of Corpus Christi.

Subsequently, they were set to music separately by several Renaissance composers and later, by several Romantic Era ones. The best known one today, is the 19th century setting by the French composer, Cesar Franck.

The hymn's first three lines translate to a powerful message:

"Thus angels' bread is made The bread of man today; The Living Bread from Heaven...".

It's still the Living Bread, available to all. Bread of ancient origin, yet still relevant today. Bread to fill all needs - and any request.

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

This gospel highlights the tension between merely observing the law and really giving oneself totally and wholeheartedly to the way of Christ. Jesus makes the point that paying undue attention to the material things of life will ultimately mean too little attention is given to the spiritual dimension and our relationship with God. It is not the owning of property that is the hindrance. The real problem lies in the fact that this man gives greater priority to his wealth than he does to following Christ. He is missing the point!

FIRST READING: Wisdom 7:7-11

A reading from the book of Wisdom.

I prayed, and understanding was given me; I called on God, and the spirit of wisdom came to me. I preferred her to sceptres and thrones, and I accounted wealth as nothing in comparison with her.

Neither did I liken to her any priceless gem, because all gold is but a little sand in her sight, and silver will be accounted as clay before her. I loved her more than health and beauty, and I chose to have her rather than light, because her radiance never ceases. All good things came to me along with her, and in her hands uncounted wealth.

'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; Youi shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother.'" He said to Jesus,

"Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth."
Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said,
"You lack one thing; go sell what you own,
and give the money to the poor,
and you will have treasure in heaven;
then come, follow me."
When the man heard this,
he was shocked and went away grieving,
for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!"

And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again.

"Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God"

They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus looked at them and said,

"For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible." *

Peter began to say to him,

"Look, we have left everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Truly I tell you,

there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields,

for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields—but with persecutions—

and in the age to come, eternal life."
