DID YOU KNOW?

In the ancient world, and particularly in Jewish culture, family meant everything. One's identity was completely tied up with family. Families absolutely depended on one another for survival and for personal identity. Young men were identified by who their father was. Women quite literally 'belonged' to their father or husband. The entire fabric of society and tradition was held together by extended families. For Jesus to say that his message would tear families apart was to say that all of society would be transformed by the message. The kingdom of God turns expectations and society on their head, breathing new life into tired, restrictive structures.

REFLECTION

A fierce fire in a eucalyptus forest bursts open the seed pods, cleanses the soil of smothering undergrowth, and returns nutrients to the soil to germinate the seeds. It is that sort of fire which Jesus brings to the earth.

So, at Pentecost, He sent His Holy Spirit '. . . like tongues of fire', bursting the early disciples out of the protective shell of the 'Upper Room', allowing them to be germinated as seeds of the early Church. It is the same in every generation which has to ask: What personal, family or social situations provide a hard casing which must be cracked open? What is the smothering undergrowth which prevents our germination as fearless disciples?

Jesus himself felt smothered by the smallminded people of Nazareth to which He never returned. He warns that families and good friends can try to smother the spark He wishes to ignite.

We might pause for a moment to pray that the fiery Holy Spirit might enable us to become a stand of tall trees reaching for the Risen Son in all His glory.

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 38:1-2, 4-6, 8-10

A reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah.

The officials of King Zedekiah heard the words that Jeremiah was saying to all the people: "Thus says the Lord:

'Those who stay in the city shall die;

but those who go out to the Chaldeans shall live."

Then the officials said to the king,

"This man ought to be put to death;

because he is discouraging the soldiers

who are left in this city,

and all the people,

by speaking such words to them.

For this man is not seeking

the welfare of this people,

but their harm."

King Zedekiah said: "Here he is; he is in your hands;

for the king is powerless against you."

So they took Jeremiah

and threw him into the cistern of Malchiah,

the king's son, which was in the court of the guard,

letting Jeremiah down by ropes.

Now there was no water in the cistern,

but only mud,

and Jeremiah sank in the mud.

So Ebed-melech, the Ethiopian,

an officer of the king's house,

left the king's house and spoke to the king.

"My lord king,

these men have acted wickedly

in all they did to the prophet Jeremiah

by throwing him into the cistern

to die there of hunger,

for there is no bread left the city."

Then the king commanded

Ebed-melech the Ethiopian,

"Take three men with you from here,

and pull the prophet Jeremiah up from the cistern

before he dies."

Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right of the throne of God. Consider Jesus who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary or lose heart. In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood.
