PASTORAL LETTER FROM ARCHBISHOP COMENSOLI WELCOME HOME!

Please find on the Parish website, a Pastoral Letter from Archbishop Comensoli regarding the lifting of the general dispensation from our Sunday and Holy Day obligations as from the **First Sunday in Advent, 27 November 2022.**

The ordinary individual exemptions will remain in place for reasons of ill health, family care of the vulnerable etc. Now that we can fully gather without restrictions, there is no longer a general need for televising or streaming of Parish Masses.

The 11.00am Sunday Mass from the Cathedral on Community TV C31 (Channel 44) and the Archdiocesan YouTube channel (including daily Mass via YouTube) will continue as normal.

Christ the King

The Feast of Christ the King was introduced to the liturgical calendar by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The establishment of the feast took place in a world that had suffered through the First World War and was unknowingly heading towards the Second World War. In this setting, the world was experiencing a dramatic growth in secularism and an even more dramatic growth in dictators who were rising to power in various states. The introduction of the feast was a call back from the secular and a call to remember Christ as having authority above and beyond any earthly leader.

FIRST READING: 2 Samuel 5.1-3

A reading from the second book of Samuel.

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron, and said,

“Look, we are your bone and flesh.

For some time, when Saul was king over us, it was you who led out Israel and brought it in.

The Lord said to you,

‘It is you who shall be shepherd

of my people Israel,

you who shall be ruler of Israel.’”

So all the elders of Israel

came to the king at Hebron,

and King David made a covenant with them

at Hebron before the Lord,

and they anointed David king over Israel.
