

FIRST READING: Sirach 15:15-20

A Reading from the book of Sirach.

If you choose, you can keep the commandments, and to act faithfully is matter of your own choice. The Lord has placed before you fire and water; stretch out your hand for whichever you choose. Before each person are life and death, and whichever we choose will be given. For great is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power and sees everything; his eyes are on those who fear him; and he knows every human action. He has not command anyone to be wicked, and he has not given anyone permission to sin.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 2.6-10

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

My brothers and sisters among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. As it is written, "what no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived what god has prepared for those who love him." These things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.
