REFLECTION

The readings for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time share a common theme: finding faith amidst life's storms. In the First Reading, Prophet Elijah learned that faith is found in the stillness of our hearts, even in turbulent times. The Gospel tells of Peter walking on water towards Jesus but doubting amidst the storm. Yet, Jesus reminded him that true faith keeps our focus on Him.

Both stories show that faith is not just a feeling or the absence of difficulties. It's a steadfast trust in God's presence and power. When we face challenges, we must turn to God and listen for His voice.

In life's storms, God's gentle presence brings comfort, just as He whispered to Elijah and rescued Peter. With unwavering faith, we can overcome trials. God is always with us, inviting us to trust Him and anchor our faith in His love.

1ST COLLECTION (PRESBYTERY OFFERING)


to be taken up after the **Homily** is for the Presbytery Account, which supports not only Fr Ralph, but also supports the other priests in our Parish.
