REFLECTION

This Sunday is world Day of Migrants and Refugees, the theme of which is, 'Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay'. It's an opportunity to honour those who have come to Australia seeking a new life and to tell their stories.

In today's Gospel, we hear a parable about workers who were employed at different times of the day yet paid the same wage at the end of the day. God's ways are certainly not our ways. In the Kingdom of God,

there is no privileged class. Whether we were baptised as infants and have worked for God all our lives or whether we heard God's call later in life and converted to Christianity as adults, we are all invited to share the same heaven. God loves those who have come late to the vineyard just as much as the early ones. We are all workers in the Lord's vineyard and each of us contributes in our own way in building up Christ's Body, the Church.

The Pharisees thought they were God's first friends but they failed to recognise His ways. We too can fall into this same trap. Some Christians think they have a right to claim a better place in God's Kingdom because they are "saved". Some think that God loves them more than those who are not "saved". This parable warns us to discard such thoughts when we start comparing ourselves to others or the work we do in comparison to what others do, we are no longer aligned to God's ways.

DID YOU KNOW?

Points of interest and Catholic lore
In the Greco-Roman world, casual labourers used to
gather in the agora or town-square waiting for employers
to hire them.

• In the early church, those who had believed in the risen Christ from the earliest days—and had thus suffered persecution for their faith—were sometimes jealous of those, especially Gentiles, who came to belief later on.

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

The 'vineyard' in the Hebrew Scriptures always referred to Israel, the people of God, while the 'master' was God. This parable would have been clearly understood as being about the experience of being gathered into God's people and about who was welcomed into the kingdom. The unbounded generosity of God is highlighted.

1ST COLLECTION (PRESBYTERY OFFERING)

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

My brothers and sisters: It is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be put to shame in any way, but that by my speaking with all boldness, Christ will be exalted now as always in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labour for me: and I do not know which I prefer. I am hard pressed between the two: my desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better: but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you. Live your life in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that, whether I come and see you or am absent and hear about you, I will know that you are standing firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel.
