
Safeguarding is Everyone's Responsibility.

# INTERPRETING YOUR PARISH SOCIAL PROFILE FOR MISSION

The Episcopal Vicar for the Eastern Region invites all interested parishioners from parishes in the inner eastern region to an information session on Tuesday 20 February, 5.00pm - 7.30 pm, at The Friars Room, adjacent to St Francis Xavier Church, 1087 Whitehorse Rd, Box Hill (Parking behind the Church off Dorking Rd). We will look at how best to interpret the parish profile from the 2021 census and the trends revealed and then share suggestions about how this will inform our efforts in Mission.

#### REFLECTION

Our readings today are all about listening. Moses tells the people that God will raise up a prophet from among them, who will speak in God's name and with authority, and that it's to him they'll need to listen. Our responsorial psalm urges us to open our hearts to God's voice. Paul encourages the people of Corinth to free themselves from worry and to listen to God—he promotes the single life as a way to be fully focused on the Lord's affairs. And our Gospel readings describes an encounter in the synagogue in Capernaum, where we find Jesus teaching with authority and driving out unclean spirits. While the onlookers aren't sure what it all means, they recognise Jesus brings authority and a teaching they have never heard before. Today, let's reflect: what do I hear God saying to me today? How well do I listen?

#### Historical Context

In an age when most people were illiterate, Jesus appears to have been quite well educated. Some suggest that he may have spoken three or four different languages. He obviously spoke everyday Aramaic, as it was spoken in that region. Jesus also appears to have been taught Hebrew, the language of religious texts and religious practice. Greek, the language of trade in marketplaces, was a language that Jesus probably used when helping Joseph sell his carpentry products at stalls and markets. Finally, Jesus probably picked up a reasonable amount of Latin, the language of the Roman occupiers - he was able to hold a conversation with Pontius Pilate.

#### YEAR OF PRAYER

On Sunday 21 January, Pope Francis officially inaugurated the Year of Prayer ahead of the 2025 Jubilee. In comments after the Sunday Angelus, Pope Francis spoke about our need of 'rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer, prayer in personal life, in the life of the Church, prayer in the world.' The Pope pointed to conflict around the world, saying we should 'not tire of invoking the Lord for peace'. Pope Francis writes:

'Prayer is the breath of faith; it is its most proper expression. Like a cry that issues from the heart of those who believe and entrust themselves to God.'

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

Moses spoke to the people; he said: The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you shall heed such a prophet. This is what you requested of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly when you said: If I hear the voice of the Lord my God any more, or ever again see this great fire, I will die. Then the Lord replied to me: They are right in what they have said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people; I will put my words in the mouth of the prophet, who shall speak to them everything that I command. Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet shall speak in my name, I myself will hold accountable. But any prophet who speaks in the name of other gods. or who presumes to speak in my name a word that I have not commanded the prophet to speak that prophet shall die.

I say this for your own benefit, not to put any restraint upon you, but to promote good order and unhindered devotion to the Lord.
