

Soles for Christ 2020

At first, trickling in, and then bag upon bag, box upon box until the tables at the west end of our Gathering Space were filled to overflowing with shoes and socks for local school children and youth. In the midst of a global pandemic, we were uncertain how well our annual "Soles for Christ" shoe drive would go but uncertainty soon gave way to certainty and gratitude for the generous hearts of our parishioners. This season of physical distancing, self-quarantine, and a dispensation from Holy Mass for at-risk parishioners has presented many challenges to all of us! But, our parishioners still found a way to share hope by giving to those who are most vulnerable, especially during this time. Our gathering of "soles" will be picked up by staff/volunteers with the AFL-CIO and will be distributed to young people at their site and in the local schools. From the Desk of Fr. Christian

Dear friends,

It's really great to be back home and at the parish. I am so very grateful that I was able to have this time to spiritually renew. I am so thankful for Fr. Gabe and the parish staff for taking care of things while I was away. Thank you all as for the prayers and support. I really missed everyone and thought about the parish and prayed for you everyday.

I'd like to take a little time here to share with you some of the graces of the retreat. The main point I'd like to emphasize is that I come out of this time away with a greater sense of hope and inner peace. My relationship with the Lord is renewed and strengthened. More than ever, Jesus is the foundation and the rock of my life and I want evermore for him to live His Eternal Priesthood through me. I desire that my heart be conformed to His gentle and meek heart. The silence of the retreat was such a great gift. When fears and anxiety would begin to stir instead of turning to a distraction such as my phone or some electronic device I could turn to the Lord and speak to Him about it. In several places at the retreat center were the words: "In the silence . . . God speaks." This is so true. I hope to be able to have more silence in my life so I can better hear the voice of God and learn what it is He wants for me and what is His will. I feel more firm in my vocation as a priest and I look forward to living out the rest of my life as a priest of Jesus Christ and serving His people.

I'd also like to share with you a couple of surprises that I experienced on the retreat. There were some elements that I was unaware of that made things more interesting. The first is, in addition to the 4 hours of focused prayer, about 1/4 of the way through the retreat we were asked to add a "5th hour" which needed to be between the times of midnight and 4am. This was initially very difficult for me but it slowly became habit and routine and I even sort of looked forward to it. Regardless, I was more than happy when my spiritual director said that I didn't need to do it anymore for the last week of the retreat. The other thing was that I began finding myself praying more between those official set hours of prayer. In other words, prayer was in a sense constant and the ordinary things became intimate encounters with the Lord. I spent a lot of time outside, looking at the beauty of God's creation. Just looking up at the sky and admiring the clouds and watching the sun set in the evening was delightful. I also found a lot of peace just walking around the property and taking in the sights and sounds. Something else that surprised me was that we were given 2 days of repose. Which meant during those time we could talk and even make road trips do some sight seeing. These were very welcome breaks and broke up some of the monotony. I was able to share some time with other priests and seminarians and visit the beautiful city of Sioux Fall, SD. Overall, this time of 30 days was much more challenging that I had ever imagined.

So, it's great to be back. This Sunday the song by Aerosmith kept going through my mind: "I'm Back on the Saddle Again" . . . I was thinking that might make a good entrance song! Anyways, it's great to be back on the saddle so to speak. I saddle up knowing that I am not alone and more confident in the Lord's help.

Safety Protocols: At Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, we have serious, significant and necessary protocols in place when attending Mass. All who enter and exit are to please wear their facial mask, and while walking in line to Holy Communion. Out of kindness and humility, we ask that all please practice “social distancing.” If you have symptoms (coughing, fever, etc.), please don’t enter the church. If coughing or sneezing begins while seated in the pew, please cover your face. **All four Missouri Bishops continue to dispense all Catholics from attending Mass at this time.** We will continue to livestream Holy Mass on Sunday at 8:30 a.m. so that those unable to physically attend may maintain a spiritual connection with Our Lady of Guadalupe. We are grateful for the cooperation of all!

R.C.I.A. – The parish is NOW registering adults for the R.C.I.A. process. We plan to begin the weekly sessions a bit earlier than in the past, on Tues., Aug. 18th, 6:30 p.m. in Marian Hall. We will have safety protocols in place and, if need be as the year progresses, we may need to move to online sessions. If you have a friend or family member, please pass this information on to them and invite them to contact the parish office (Kathy), so we can greet them personally and get them registered. R.C.I.A. is a gradual process of education, faith formation, study and personal conversion to prepare for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and lifetime of living the Catholic faith. 




