

From the Desk of Fr. Christian

Dear friends,

Given our powerful readings from last weekend I would like to comment a little more about forgiveness. It’s such an important thing to talk about and most of all to practice!

We heard last Sunday these words from Matthew’s Gospel: “*So will my Heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart.*” It is a common thing to hear people say that “I am having a hard time forgiving somebody” or “I don’t feel like I’ve forgiven.” This only makes sense though because when somebody has wronged us our feelings and emotions are injured - and they take time to heal. We also have memory - which is a gift - but which causes us to recall past hurts - renewing the wounds.

Yes. It is difficult to forgive and most especially to **feel** as though we’ve forgiven . . . But we are still called to forgive generously as God forgives. Seventy-seven times - again, and again, and again, and again . . . Our Lord gives us great insight into forgiveness in telling us where the work of forgiveness takes place. He says “unless each of you forgives your brother from your **heart**” . . . The place of forgiveness is within the depths of one’s heart.

The Catechism teaches us that the heart is where “everything is bound and loosed.” (CCC 2843) Each of us has the power to bind and loose. We often underestimate that power - because our emotions and feelings get the best of us. What do I mean by that? Well, the faculty of the heart is our will . . . So when we will to forgive somebody by making a simple act of the will: “I forgive you” or “I forgive this or that person” and mean it than you have forgiven. You have truly forgiven that person by willing it . . . even though it doesn’t quite feel like it.

The question arises then: How do we heal our memory and emotions? How do they eventually match what we have willed to do? Once again . . . Our Lord gives us the answer. He says: “You must forgive seventy times seven” which means . . . Over and over and over again . . . When our memory recalls a past hurt that somebody inflicted upon us . . . We must once again - with our will - within the heart - forgive again. Repeat . . . Repeat . . . Repeat. Gradually . . . over time and through the grace of the Holy Spirit whom we invite into our hearts - emotional wounds soon turn to compassion and the memory is purified - transforming hurt into intercession. (CCC 2843) Such is the power of God’s grace to transform our hearts to a heart of compassion which even wills the good of those have injured us.

“So will my Heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart.”

Is there somebody in your life that you need to forgive . . . ? Do it now - within your heart - unloosen the chain which does nothing but weigh you down. We say, “I forgive . . .” again and again . . . And then the healing begins.
