

The Catechism of the Catholic Church

Catechism of the Catholic Church - Paragraphs 402 - 404

402 All men are implicated in Adam's sin, as St. Paul affirms: "By one man's disobedience many (that is, all men) were made sinners": "sin came into the world through one man and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all men sinned." The Apostle contrasts the universality of sin and death with the universality of salvation in Christ. "Then as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one man's act of righteousness leads to acquittal and life for all men."

403 Following St. Paul, the Church has always taught that the overwhelming misery which oppresses men and their inclination towards evil and death cannot be understood apart from their connection with Adam's sin and the fact that he has transmitted to us a sin with which we are all born afflicted, a sin which is the "death of the soul". Because of this certainty of faith, the Church baptizes for the remission of sins even tiny infants who have not committed personal sin.

404 How did the sin of Adam become the sin of all his descendants? The whole human race is in Adam "as one body of one man". By this "unity of the human race" all men are implicated in Adam's sin, as all are implicated in Christ's justice. Still, the transmission of original sin is a mystery that we cannot fully understand. But we do know by Revelation that Adam had received original holiness and justice not for himself alone, but for all human nature. By yielding to the tempter, Adam and Eve committed a personal sin, but this sin affected the human nature that they would then transmit in a fallen state. It is a sin which will be transmitted by propagation to all mankind, that is, by the transmission of a human nature deprived of original holiness and justice. and that is why original sin is called "sin" only in an analogical sense: it is a sin "contracted" and not "committed" - a state and not an act.

A Letter from Fr. Christian

Dear faithful,

I would like to take the opportunity to highlight an upcoming opportunity for confession. I feel like the culture of confession has very much changed in St. Joseph. Years ago, your only choice was sometime before the Saturday evening Mass. Today, however, pretty much all parishes in St. Joseph offer confession before every Mass, both weekend and weekday. There really isn't an excuse not to go. That being said, I realize that some folks will only go when confessions are offered on a designated evening of Advent and Lent with guest priests. I'm all about making the sacrament accessible to all. Therefore, Tuesday, December 20th, there will be the opportunity for confession from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Come when you can, and someone will be here between that time. If we have to go past 9:00 pm, all the better. As I said in my homily 2 weeks ago, "If it's been over a year, it's been too long." May the use of this beautiful sacrament be a means of preparing for the coming of Christ in your heart.



Serving God and Others




