

Mark your Calendar for November 8 ~ Saint Anthony Chapel, located on Troy Hill, which overlooks the Allegheny River on Pittsburgh's North Side, is home to the largest collection of Christian relics in the world outside of the Vatican. This Shrine, dedicated to the "Wonder-Worker" St. Anthony of Padua, houses a vast collection of relics and has been designated a Historical Landmark by the Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation. Walking into the chapel, you're immediately surrounded by centuries of history and devotion. The relics are beautifully displayed in reliquaries lining the walls, including pieces connected to over 500 saints, and even a fragment of the True Cross.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

Students and their aide, Miss Elaina, each shared 5-10 items representing who they are and what makes them special and unique.





Catholic Book Club ~ Maria Simma is a mystic who was born in Sonntag, Austria, to poor peasant farmers in 1915. They were humble Catholic country folk with a simple yet very devout faith in God. Beginning in 1940, Maria began to be visited by souls in purgatory. It is important to note that Maria never sought these visits. She never called upon them or "channeled"

them in any way. The holy souls told her that it is God, in His great mercy, who gave them permission to come to her to obtain sacrifices and prayers that their time in purgatory might be lessened. The holy souls appeared to Maria for 64 years until her death in 2004 and repeatedly told her that the greatest thing we can do to help is to have Masses offered for them. The holy Rosary and the Stations of the Cross are also very beneficial.

According to Maria, the greatest "complaint" of the souls in Purgatory is how they are almost completely forgotten by their family and loved ones and rightly complain that they receive no spiritual help from those who they themselves helped so much during life. How few prayers are ever offered up for them, even at their funerals. Yet prayer is precisely what they need the most! During her visits with the holy souls, they revealed much to Maria about their lives, and the world around us as seen through God's eyes. This book is a compilation of over 60 detailed interviews that took place over a two-year period with the author, Nicky Eltz. It will give you a glimpse into purgatory and heaven and reveal much about our faith and how it relates to the world around us. Most importantly, it will inspire your faith and increase your devotion to the holy souls in purgatory. This is truly a must-read book.

Broken Mary: The Kevin Matthews Story (Rated PG-13) ~ Showing one day only, Tuesday, October 7th, at the Mills Movie Theater. It's Chicago in the 1980s and '90s, and Kevin Matthews has it all as one of the nation's most recognized on-air radio personalities. He's partying with celebrities, rubbing shoulders with famous athletes, and the world is at his fingertips. Then everything changes – he's diagnosed with a debilitating illness, and the spotlight gradually slips away. At the height of his anguish, he stumbles upon a broken statue of the Virgin Mary, and his life takes an unexpected turn. In this moment of spiritual awakening, Kevin finds his true purpose, discovering what matters most. Calling himself "Mary's Roadie," he offers his fans something deeper: inspiration and hope.

PA March for Life 2025 #4 ~ The trip to Harrisburg was very overcast this year with dense fog in the mountains, but it was still a beautiful drive. I saw the largest herd of cows I have ever seen in PA. I love seeing cows in the field. They don't have a care in the world. They do not have to worry that someone is trying to kill their calves. Calves are valuable for what they will provide when they are grown, whether it is milk or beef. Human babies are totally helpless and are seen by many as an inconvenience and a financial burden. Millions of babies never get to see their mother's face or feel the warmth of the sun. I pray this changes very soon. Christ does not like to see his innocent little ones hurt.

Our number at the rally this year was the largest since the rally started four years ago, again with more young people and clergy participating. We heard two wonderful adoption stories, heard from ProLife Advocates, and then State Senators and Representatives after the Mass. They reminded us that this battle for life is more than just this march, that we must continue to fight by giving our support to Pregnancy Resource Centers (which have lost most of their state funding) and to vote for our ProLife Senators and Representatives. There were approx. 35,000 abortions in PA in 2024, and there were approx. 53,000 couples waiting for a baby to adopt.

There were several bishops. I lost count of the priests and seminarians that served Mass. Our own Bishop Waltersheid was there and our past pastor from Transfiguration, Fr. John Sweeney, was also there. When Archbishop Perez saw a sign that read "Let Them Live", it became the chant of the March. We had 11 students from St. Joe's in Natrona on our bus, and they were a good group of kids. For some of them, it was their second and third March.

A special "Thank You" to the Knights of Columbus of the Greensburg Diocese who donated the buses once again, enabling so many of us to attend the march. And an even bigger "Thank You" to the parishioners of Our Lady of the Lakes Parish for donating \$1,142 to our Red Rose Birthright Collection this past weekend. The babies thank you! God Bless you all!
