Today, we celebrate the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel (Lk 6:17, 20-26), we are presented with the time when Jesus preaches about blessings and warns against other things. It is Luke's account of the Sermon on the Plain. This is also recorded in Matthew

chapter 5 as the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus says, "Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man," (LK 6:22). Contrary to what the people of that culture believed, they would be blessed if they were excluded or insulted on the account of Jesus. The same is true today. The topic, sometimes referred to as counter-culturalism, is addressed in many religious teachings. On the website of FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students), we are reminded that many students "are desperate to find meaning in their lives, looking for happiness in all the wrong places." St. Benedict Joseph Labre said, "Our consolation is not here: we shall have It eternally in paradise." On Sunday nights, Divine Mercy Youth discusses ways we can live in eternal paradise and get to heaven. We also discuss many other teachings of Jesus including the radical ideologies of biblical times and examine topics regarding Our Blessed Mother. Under the protection of Mary's mantle, you are invited to join us!

Divine Mercy Youth is a high school ministry for all 8th - 12th grade students. Our aim is to help teens grow in intentional discipleship through prayer, community, and formation. Divine Mercy Youth is held on Sunday Nights following the 6pm mass and will serve as the catechetical program for all students who are not in Catholic school. 

From the Office of the Pastor of Divine Mercy Parish Reverend Father Robert T. Cooper

LIVESTREAM MASSES ENDING

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord:

In March of 2020, we entered into a new world of livestreaming Masses at Divine Mercy Parish due to the COVID-19 pandemic. After much prayer and appropriate consultation, I have decided to discontinue this effort on March 1, 2022, based on two factors.

First, more parishioners are returning to Church to attend Mass in-person so our online viewership is very minimal, even in the current COVID-19 climate. Secondly and more urgently, we need to return to communal worship and the reception of the sacraments. The components of the Mass are communal and personal. They are rooted in Jewish worship. The Liturgy of the Word fulfills and replaces worship in the synagogues, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist fulfills and replaces the Temple sacrifices with the One Sacrifice of Jesus. The reception of Jesus during Communion—His body, blood, soul, and divinity—prepares us to return to the world and to love others as Jesus loves us and this cannot be replaced by viewing the Liturgy virtually.

Let's examine this for a moment in the context of St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians.

"Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:6–11)

Biblical commentators believe this is one of the earliest New Testament texts concerning the divinity of Jesus Christ. It is often called a Christological hymn, and it is believed that the early Christians would chant these words in the liturgy as a type of Creed. The part that grabs my attention these days is about "every knee bending and confessing that Jesus Christ is Lord." I envision a great choir kneeling, proclaiming, and confessing the Lordship of Jesus.

There really is something powerful about worshipping our Lord on bended knee. Fr. George Rutler recently wrote about a Desert Father around 300 A.D., Abba Apollo, who had a vision of Satan: "The devil has no knees. He cannot kneel; he cannot adore; he can only look down his nose in contempt. Being unwilling to bend the knee at the name of Jesus is the essence of evil." (cf. Is. 45:23, Rm. 14:11). As creatures, we are made to adore the Lord. As creatures of body and soul, we are made to adore with bended knee. As social creatures, we are made to do this together, communally.

Just as we need to adore, and we need to adore with bended knee, so we also need to be together. And, at some point, that means coming back to in-person Masses. Chesterton said this: "A dead thing can go with the stream, but only a living thing can go against it." As I think about that, and our current circumstances, I am tempted to paraphrase it this way: "A dead thing can go with the livestream, but only a living thing can go against it." Swimming upstream takes effort. Calling people back to Mass will take an effort on the part of the entire Christian community.

As pastor, I am grateful to Deacon Larry, Austin, and our friends at Hope and Purpose Ministries for helping us over the past two years to video, edit, and livestream the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during unpredicted times. We will continue to use our upgraded technology in the Church building to make Sunday homilies and other events available either through recordings or livestreaming as a tool for evangelization and catechesis. Sunday homilies are currently posted to the parish website

(www.divinemercyparish.org/ipadre-audio-homilies) so that the mysteries of the faith and the guiding principles of the Christian

(www.divinemercyparish.org/ipadre-audio-homilies) so that the mysteries of the faith and the guiding principles of the Christian life expounded from Sacred Scripture may be made available to a wider audience. While this catechetical tool can never be a substitute for attending Mass, it is fruitful insofar as it advances the spiritual journey of the faithful towards the beatific vision.

Let us hear the words of Pope Francis: "This is the Church in a difficult situation that the Lord is allowing, but the ideal of the Church is always with the people and with the sacraments — always ... The Church, the sacraments and the people of God are concrete." The faithful's relationship with God must also stay concrete, as the apostles lived it, as a community and with the people of God, not lived in a selfish way as individuals or lived in a "viral" way that is spread only online. "May the Lord teach us this intimacy with Him, this familiarity with Him, but in the Church, with the sacraments, with the holy faithful people of God."

FINALIZACIÓN DE TRANSMISIÓN EN VIVO DE LAS MISAS

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en el Señor:

En marzo de 2020, entramos en un nuevo mundo de misas en vivo en la parroquia de la Divina Misericordia debido a la pandemia de COVID-19. Después de mucha oración y consulta apropiada, he decidido suspender este esfuerzo el 1 de marzo de 2022, basado en dos factores.

Primero, más feligreses están regresando a la Iglesia para asistir a misa en persona, por lo que nuestra audiencia en línea es muy mínima, incluso en el clima actual de COVID-19. En segundo lugar, y con mayor urgencia, necesitamos volver al culto comunitario y a la recepción de los sacramentos. Los componentes de la Misa son comunitarios y personales. Están arraigados en la adoración Judía. La Liturgia de la Palabra cumple y reemplaza la adoración en las sinagogas, y la Liturgia de la Eucaristía cumple y reemplaza los sacrificios del Templo con el Único Sacrificio de Jesús. La recepción de Jesús durante la Comunión —Su cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad— nos prepara para regresar al mundo y amar a los demás como Jesús nos ama y esto no puede ser reemplazado por ver la Liturgia virtualmente.

Examinemos esto por un momento en el contexto de la Carta de San Pablo a los Filipenses.

"El, siendo de condición divina, no se apegó a su igualdad con Dios, sino que se redujo a nada, tomando la condición de servidor, y se hizo semejante a los hombres. Y encontrándose en la condición humana, se rebajó a sí mismo haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte, y muerte en una cruz. Por eso Dios lo engrandeció y le dio el Nombre que está sobre todo nombre, para que al Nombre de Jesús se doble toda rodilla en los cielos, en la tierra y entre los muertos, y toda lengua proclame que Cristo Jesús es el Señor, para gloria de Dios Padre." (Filipenses 2:6–11)

Los comentaristas bíblicos creen que este es uno de los primeros textos del Nuevo Testamento concernientes a la divinidad de Jesucristo. A menudo se le llama un himno cristológico, y se cree que los primeros cristianos cantaban estas palabras en la liturgia como un tipo de Credo. La parte que llama mi atención en estos días es acerca de "cada rodilla doblando y confesando que Jesucristo es el Señor". Imagino un gran coro arrodillado, proclamando y confesando el señorío de Jesús.

Realmente hay algo poderoso en adorar a nuestro Señor con la rodilla doblada. El P. George Rutler escribió recientemente sobre un Padre del Desierto alrededor del año 300 D.C., Abba Apolo, que tuvo una visión de Satanás: "El diablo no tiene rodillas. No puede arrodillarse; no puede adorar; solo puede mirar por la nariz con desprecio. No estar dispuesto a doblar la rodilla ante el nombre de Jesús es la esencia del mal". (cf. Is. 45:23, Rom. 14:11). Como criaturas, estamos hechos para adorar al Señor. Como criaturas de cuerpo y alma, estamos hechos para adorar con la rodilla doblada. Como criaturas sociales, estamos hechos para hacer esto juntos, comunitariamente.

Así como necesitamos adorar, y necesitamos adorar con las rodillas dobladas, también necesitamos estar juntos. Y, en algún momento, eso significa volver a las misas en persona. Chesterton dijo esto: "Una cosa muerta puede ir con la corriente, pero solo una cosa viva puede ir en su contra". Mientras pienso en eso, y en nuestras circunstancias actuales, me siento tentado a parafrasearlo de esta manera: "Una cosa muerta puede ir con la transmisión en vivo, pero solo una cosa viva puede ir en contra de ella". Nadar río arriba requiere esfuerzo. Llamar a la gente a misa requerirá un esfuerzo por parte de toda la comunidad cristiana.

Como pastor, estoy agradecido con el Diácono Larry, Austin y nuestros amigos de *Hope and Purpose Ministries* por ayudarnos en los últimos dos años a grabar, editar y transmitir en vivo el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa durante tiempos imprevistos. Continuaremos utilizando nuestra tecnología mejorada en el edificio de la Iglesia para hacer que las homilías dominicales y otros eventos estén disponibles, ya sea a través de grabaciones o transmisiones en vivo como una herramienta para la evangelización y la catequesis. Las homilías dominicales están actualmente publicadas en el sitio web de la parroquia (www.divinemercyparish.org/ipadre-audio-homilies) para que los misterios de la fe y los principios rectores de la vida cristiana expuestos en la Sagrada Escritura puedan ponerse a disposición de un público más amplio. Si bien esta herramienta catequética nunca puede ser un sustituto de la asistencia a la Misa, es fructífera en la medida en que avanza el camino espiritual de los fieles hacia la visión beatífica.

Escuchemos las palabras del Papa Francisco: "Esta es la Iglesia en una situación difícil que el Señor está permitiendo, pero el ideal de la Iglesia está siempre con el pueblo y con los sacramentos, siempre... La Iglesia, los sacramentos y el pueblo de Dios son concretos". La relación de los fieles con Dios también debe ser concreta, como la vivieron los apóstoles, como comunidad y con el pueblo de Dios, no vivida de manera egoísta como individuos o vivida de una manera "viral" que se difunde solo en línea. "Que el Señor nos enseñe esta intimidad con Él, esta familiaridad con Él, pero en la Iglesia, con los sacramentos, con el santo pueblo fiel de Dios".

The Great Hospital of Souls

"The great miracle of the Curé of Ars," one of his contemporaries said during the process for beatification "was his confessional, besieged day and night." The fundamental reason why the Year for Priests had been called by Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI on the 150th anniversary of the birth of St. John Vianney into eternal life was not that he left us a body of inspiring sermons like Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen. It was not principally because of the angelic way he would celebrate Mass, his all night vigils of prayer, his fasting on boiled potatoes, his legendary battles against the devil, or his famous love and care for orphans. What made him famous, what earned him the reputation of being a saint in his lifetime and the title of the patron saint of priests after his death, was what God did through him in his "besieged" confessional.

For much of his 41 years in Ars, a town that had 230 souls when he arrived, he heard confessions of more than its entire population each day. He used to hear 12-14 hours of confessions in the winter and 16-18 hours in the summer. Most of us, in hearing those numbers, would naturally admire his commitment and dedication, much like we would commend anyone who worked 18 hour days in loving service of others. When I was a seminarian, I used to applaud the concrete "priority" he gave to the sacrament of confession, which obviously would have required many other sacrifices. It was only in December of 2007, however—while hearing confessions at my first Advent penance service—that I really understood what St. John Vianney's commitment really meant. That night, I sat in the confessional and heard confessions for three hours. I likened it to Jesus' three hours on the cross. Even though I was used to pushing my body to the limit, I had never been so totally exhausted. My back ached. My bottom ached. My whole body ached, but I took solace at least that I could still feel it. My mind, on the other hand, felt totally depleted. A year later, when preaching a parish Lenten Mission, I heard 12 hours of confessions stretched from Monday night through Wednesday night. At the end of the mission, I was comatose.

When I think now about the Curé of Ars' hearing confessions for 12-18 hours a day, the closest analogy I would give would be to running 25-40 miles a day ... uphill ... into gale force winds ... with ankle weights ... and wrist weights ... in full body armor ... made of lead. Moreover, he did it almost every day for decades. What St. John Vianney did in the confessional is, to me, the physical equivalent of doing a triathlon for the last 11,000 days of his life. It gives new meaning to the term heroism. This is the first reason why we can say that the great miracle of the Curé of Ars was his confessional because his daily stamina makes everything else look like minor feats in comparison.


The second reason his confessional was miraculous was because of what was occurring on the other side of the screen. People from all over France were making their way to an inaccessible hamlet in the southeastern corner of the country, taking primitive trains, even more primitive horse-drawn carts, and often walking for miles in fog, rain, and mud. Once there, they would in general need to wait up to eight days in a church that was stiflingly warm in summer and ice cold in the winter in order to have their confession heard. Why wouldn't they have taken the easy way out and just have gone to confession to one of the priests in their cities or town? Why would as many as 4,000 people have shown up one day, and 120,000 in a year, to go to confession to this simple priest in a tiny village?

They were coming, as one of the penitents once said, because they were encountering "God in a man." In St. John Vianney, they found more than a man ordained to act in the person of Christ to absolve them of their sins. Any validly ordained priest with faculties to hear confessions could do that. They were coming to someone who incarnated the mercy of the Heavenly Father, who shared the Good Shepherd's zeal to do anything it took to bring back to the fold the one lost sheep, who would rejoice with all the saints in heaven over the repentance of one sinner, and who like Christ would willingly be hammered to the wood of his confessional to save sinners. In him, we encountered not just a



confessor who administered God's power for the forgiveness of sins, but the closest earthly approximation to the holiness of God. That drew them irresistibly and through all types of sacrifices to make the road to Ars the road to Damascus.

His besieged confessional was miraculous even more so considering that in France in the 19th century, the sacrament of penance was not popular. Sometimes Catholics today can look back to the long confessional lines in the 1950's and think that that was always the way it was until the present crisis of faith and in the practice of confession. When St. John Vianney arrived in Ars, however, most people were not practicing the faith at all, not to mention not having frequent recourse to the sacrament of penance. God used him, however, almost single-handedly, to bring the whole Church of France back to the beauty of His mercy.



Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wanted priests today to be willing to make the same heroic commitment to the confessional as their patron did, recognizing that the same miracle God worked in Ars for the Church in France He can work again. "Priests ought never to be resigned to empty confessionals or the apparent indifference of the faithful to this Sacrament," the Holy Father wrote in a letter to priests. "In France, at the time of the Cure of Ars, confession was no more easy or frequent than in our own day, since the upheaval caused by the revolution had long inhibited the practice of religion. Yet he sought in every way, by his preaching and his powers of persuasion, to help his parishioners to rediscover the meaning and beauty of the Sacrament of Penance, presenting it as an inherent demand of the Eucharistic presence. He thus created a 'virtuous' circle. By spending long hours in church before the tabernacle, he inspired the faithful to imitate him by coming to visit Jesus with the knowledge that their parish priest would be there, ready to listen and offer forgiveness. Later, the growing numbers of penitents from all over France would keep him in the confessional for up to sixteen hours a day. It was said that Ars had become 'a great hospital of souls.'"

In a 1986 letter to priests on the bicentennial of the Curé's birth, Pope St. John Paul II said that the state of the world requires that all priests should imitate the pastor of Ars in making themselves "very available" for the Sacrament of Penance. He asked them to give it "priority over other activities" so that the faithful will realize the value attached to this "most difficult, the most delicate, the most taxing and the most demanding [priestly ministry] of all—especially when priests are in short supply." Christ is asking His priests to generously open up again that "great hospital of souls," so that He can replicate in the cities and towns of the Archdiocese of New Orleans and elsewhere the great miracle He worked through one priest in Ars. He is also calling all the faithful to come to receive this universal spiritual health care.




