Today, we celebrate the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. We are presented with the time Jesus taught His disciples about retaliation. This Gospel (Mt 5:38-48) emphasizes forgiveness and mercy. Jesus says, "Love your enemies, and pray for those

who persecute you", (MT 5:44). Not only do we need mercy, but we should be merciful. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) states that St. Rose of Lima said, "We must not fail to help our neighbors, because in them we serve Jesus," (CCC2449). It also explains, "The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities," (CCC, 2447). As a Lifeteen author says, "Most agree that God is holy. Many believe in His mercy. Some souls, however, struggle mightily with this concept of God being 'kind' or wanting 'good things' for them." Whether young or old, mercy is needed. Saint -Faustina said in her diary, Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska: Divine Mercy in My Soul, "I realize more and more how much every soul needs God's mercy throughout life," (No.1036). On Sunday nights, Divine Mercy Youth discusses this mercy of God as we learn ways to trust Jesus as well as ways one can seek the mercy of God. We also explore ways we can show mercy by forgiveness with our family and friends in our homes, schools, workplaces, communities, society, and the world. In addition, we talk about topics regarding Our Blessed Mother Including Pope Francis' description of Mary as the "Mother of forgiveness." Under the protection of Mary's mantle, you are invited to join us!

Divine Mercy Youth is a high school ministry for all 8th through 12th grade students. Our aim is to help teens grow in intentional discipleship through prayer, community, and formation. Divine Mercy Youth is held on Sunday Nights following the 5pm mass and will serve as the catechetical program for all students who are not in catholic school. 



FR. COOPER'S CORNER

Ash Wednesday means ... Lent is Coming!

My Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

In recent years, many states in our nation have been shocked by the ferocity and destructiveness of forest fires. In areas near these destructive fires, everything is covered with black ash. It covers outdoor furniture, cars, footpaths, everything; it even finds its way indoors, through open windows and air vents — ash everywhere. For those directly involved in and affected by the fires, ash is a symbol of all the desolation and death they cause. Ash is what's left when the fire has done its work; it is dry, choking, bitter-tasting, and ugly.

Those of us who have visited forest fire scenes know that news captions cannot do justice to the reality. The swirls of powdery ash around our feet, the still-smoldering trees, the smell of ash in our noses, the dry crunch of every footstep, and above all, the silence, the emptiness, the 'nothingness' of the bush, everything black (or white where the fires burned hottest), everything gone.

In a few days, after the revelry of Mardi Gras has passed, you are going to be signed with a black substance on your forehead to signal the beginning of the Lenten Season. You know what it is: burnt ashes. On Ash Wednesday, the priest will take blessed ashes and place them on your forehead. This ash is the same symbol of desolation and death produced by recent fires but with a few differences.

First, this ash will be placed on your forehead at your request. No one will force you to come up to receive it; it will be purely voluntary. You will be saying: 'Give me this ash as a symbol of the destruction I wish to have happen within me this Lent; the destruction of my evil passions, the clearing of all the undergrowth in my life that is hindering my journey towards God, the destruction of all my empty attachments. I want it all cleared so that I may be free to travel more safely and more quickly.'

Secondly, the ash will be placed on your forehead in the shape of the Cross; not 'a cross' as some people say, but 'the Cross' – the Cross of Christ. This means that the ash is for us a symbol both of annihilation and hope. As the Cross is the Christian symbol of salvation and hope of eternal life, so the cross of ashes on our forehead is for us an invitation to freedom from sin and new life. In the Office of Readings for Ash Wednesday, the prophet Isaiah, in Chapter 58:1-12, describes what God offers to those who seek repentance and conversion in their lives:

Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wounds be quickly healed over. ... your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon. The Lord will always guide you, giving you relief in desert places. He will give strength to your bones and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water whose waters never run dry.



You will rebuild the ancient ruins, build up on the old foundation.
You will be called `Breach-mender,' `Restorer of ruined houses'.

Now I ask you: Isn't that exciting? What could be better than having your wounds 'quickly healed over'; your shadows become 'like noon;' your bones given strength for doing good; 'rebuilding' the ancient ruins ... 'on the old foundations' and becoming 'like a watered garden'? For anyone with the least sense of their own sinfulness and of the 'ruined house' that they have made of their soul through sin, Lent is the most wonderful time - a time of extraordinary grace - in which the Lord draws us, once again, (through the Lenten exercises of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving) closer and closer to Himself.

Thirdly, the ashes will be blessed and mixed with holy water. In the natural cycle of life, there is an explosion of green that follows rain on a burnt-out forest; the leaves burst from the very trunks of the blackened trees. Ash and water are a potent mixture for new life and on Ash Wednesday, at the beginning of our Lenten journey of prayer, penance, and almsgiving, we ask God to plant the seed of His grace into our efforts, to make them fruitful.

May God grant us the grace to have a prayerful and fruitful Lenten journey so that we may die to our own sinfulness so as to rise with Jesus on Easter morning.


