



Penance



23rd Sunday of Yr. A – 09/06/2020. Ref. 1st=Ezk.33:7-9. 2nd=Rom.13:8-10. 3rd=Mtt.18:15-20.
Theme: True Love: A debt we must pay

When St. Paul tells us (2nd reading) that ‘we should owe nothing to anyone except love’ (Rom.13:8), he wants us to understand that Love is both ‘a debt and a duty’. Love, here, does not refer to anything sentimental. As a ‘debt’, it is something we must ‘pay’ to escape condemnation and as a ‘duty’, it is something we should do to earn our rewards. How does this happen?

Having been created out of the love of God and saved by His love, we owe it – love, as a ‘debt’ to God and our fellow humans. It is our way of salvation. Jesus made this clear in His dialogue with the Lawyer who came to Him with the question, ‘Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life’ (Lk.10:25)? Jesus ended the discussion by underscoring that the love of God & of our neighbor were all we needed to inherit eternal life. In line with this, St. Paul describes Love (2nd reading) as ‘the fulfilment of the law of God’ because, it does not allow us to sin against God & does no evil to our fellow humans.

As a duty, Love becomes a task that demands courage and compels us to accept or preach the word of God. Hence, God informs Ezekiel & all of us (1st reading) of the duty to speak out/talk to those around us to change from their sinful ways of lives to avoid being held responsible for their sins. This surely, places high demand of righteousness on us. Have you ever told anyone of his/her bad or sinful behaviors you observed in him/her (or do you rather gossip behind him/her)? Do we accept the message of the word of God as talking to us directly or do we see it as directed to others - politicians, abusers or the ‘bad guys’ out there? This is a duty most Christians, especially Catholics, are weak to carry out in our world of today. We fail to do so most times because we want to protect our pride or to avoid ‘hurting’ the feelings of others – our children, spouses, parents, friends, colleagues, political admirers, etc. It could also be because we do not want to look different, we are afraid of losing our friends, we want to avoid threats to our lives or we do not want to be described as being ‘judgmental’. We have to know that the duty of love takes us out of our comfort zones to transform others. May God give us the courage to do so!

Because of the delicate nature of this duty and since it is a duty in love, Jesus tells us the steps to follow to win our brothers/sisters & friends back to God. First, He wants us to take an inter-personal approach. This helps to build mutual respect, which could make the person open up to you. It further gives us the opportunity of knowing the influences that are leading the person into errors/sin & how best to advise or correct him/her. This does not mean helping the person to hide in his sins. If this does not work, Jesus advises us to involve one or two persons. These must be someone/those who mean much or have influence in the person’s life. Where the 2nd step fails, Jesus advises us to involve a larger group who share the same ideals & faith with the person. When all these fail, Jesus said that we should treat the person as ‘a Gentile or Tax Collector’. From a spiritual perspective, this comment from Christ does not call for hatred or banishment but a call to intensify our prayers for all who do not see or are not conscious of the ‘sinfulness’ of their actions/behaviors (including you & I). Hence, in the concluding part of the gospel of today, Jesus places a great value on the prayer of the Church and our coming together to pray as a family or group. The ‘power of binding & loosing’, which Jesus first gave to Peter in Mtt.16:18 (which we discussed two Sundays ago), is now extended to the other Apostles (Mtt.18:18) to work on-behalf of Christ in collaboration with each other to save people from their sins & bring the faithful to the glory of heaven. This encourages coming together in prayers as one family, one nation and one Church who have the same hope, to pray for each other. It is our hope that godliness will rise among us to dethrone evil and that God will raise from among us, people who are courageous to witness to righteousness.

Dear friends, the ‘debt & duty’ of Love demands an urgent and courageous attention in our times. We must get involved immediately to save our souls and those of others. Let us keep praying and firmly correcting each other with love to make our world a better place to live and heaven a sure place to go.




