

25<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Yr. A - 09/20/2020. Ref. 1<sup>st</sup>=Is.55:6-9. 2<sup>nd</sup>=Phll.1:20c-24,27a. 3<sup>rd</sup>=Mtt.20:1-6a. Theme: God's equal love for us: A marvel beyond human understanding

In the gospel of today, Jesus demonstrates God's untiring search for us to engage us In His work in order to earn us His rewards. He does so, in a 'three step process'; the call, the work and the reward.

The Call: Today, Jesus wants us to understand God's eternal plan to bring us to enjoy His rewards. He does this by going out in-search of us daily from dawn to dusk. This shows how God is each day searching for us & meeting us at/in our different helpless situations to offer us a lifeline with an assurance of a happy outcome. In this gospel, Jesus wants to show us how helpless & hopeless we are without the intervention of God in our lives & affairs. Where He meets us or when He finds us is not the yardstick for the reward but our willingness to accept His call and our faithfulness in the work given us to the end (time of reward). Jesus is still going out even now, meeting us & calling us from different corners of our hidden lives to noble things that would bring us lasting happiness & rewards. Remember, He knows about our sinful/helpless situations and does not want us to remain there. He has the best reward for each of us. Saying 'yes' to Him now is the right step towards earning those rewards. The choice is yours!

The work: Furthermore, Jesus describes the Master of the vineyard as going out 'to hire laborers for his vineyard'. He is not bringing them to be idle but to be engaged in some work in order to earn his rewards. Hence, when we say 'yes' to the Christian life, we are only accepting a new & different type of 'job' that is as demanding & engaging as any other noble job we know. This new job, as seen from the 1st reading, begins with the self. Hence, it tells us; 'Seek the Lord while he may be found...call upon him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake his ways and the unrighteous his thoughts; let him turn to our God, who is generous in forgiving' (Is.55:7). God is not interested in the extent or depth of our wicked/sinful deeds but that we embrace His mercy, which is very much available in the 'new job' environment. On the other hand, Jesus wants us to understand that the 'Christian life' is an active and dynamic life which keeps us always involved. There cannot be an idle laborer. We all have to keep working both on ourselves and in the Church. Our outputs and inputs here are doors to divine rewards (now or in eternity). So, having said 'yes' to God's invitation to work in His vineyard, what particular work are we doing on ourselves or in the Church to earn His reward? Remember, He called us to 'come & work (in His vineyard) to earn a just reward' (Mtt.20:4), not to come & stand idle or to come & watch others who are working. Let us work on ourselves to take care of our weak points, take up a ministry/service in the Church & never be tired of the good we are already doing, so that (as St. Paul tells us - 2<sup>nd</sup> reading), 'Christ will be honored in our lives, whether by life or death' (Phil.120c).

The Reward: The rewards that follow our engagement & dedication to the work of the master of the vine-yard underscore. God's justice & favor which is beyond human understanding. As He said (1st reading), 'As the heavens are high above the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways & my thoughts higher than yours' (Is.55:9). Hence, against human logic, the master of the vineyard rewarded all who have worked equally, even beginning with the last group. It is human to conclude that the first group had worked more and deserved more pay. But Jesus wants us to understand that the heavenly reward is not calculated by the hours of work but by God's grace and our faithfulness. Hence, all the faithful called at the time of Abraham, those called at the time of the Apostles, ourselves today and those to be called in the future will receive the same reward of seeing God's face in heaven. There should be no room for complaint or jealousy here since the master of the vineyard kept his promise to each of the groups. We must eschew jealousy & comparison in our relationship with God in relation to other people. Let us be content with God's faithfulness to us and know that He has to be faithful to others as well.

Beloved brethren, let us know that as long as there is a soul to be saved, God is always at work among us. He is out today to seek us out from different spots of idleness, sinfulness & hopelessness with the invitation to 'work where it will pay'. May we say 'yes' to His invitation and do the job required of us without envy or comparison. Our reward will be sure and satisfying. Remain blessed. Fr. Timothy.

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During

In this series, you will learn all the Mass parts and the details of each part. We will go in depth...or at least give gentle reminders about when something happens\*, and why it is happening. Enjoy the tour!

Right smack at the beginning of the penitential act, there are a couple of ways to do this thing (which is why we will have the big important part of the Mass for yet another week). The first way to do the Penitential Act is using the Confiteor...

Confiteor /Kon-Feet-Eeyore/ To Confess

...now that's a million dollar word. And apparently, it doesn't mean "with the hooves of a fictional donkey." So, it means to confess and that is just what this prayer does, we confess that we have sinned (in thoughts and words, also known as sometimes we should keep our mouths shut). Then we say "through my fault" (x3) and strike our chests. Basically, we pound it into our stubborn human brains that, yes we messed up, yes it was our own fault, and yes we did it on purpose (because if we didn't know it was a sin, then that isn't through our fault). Even better about this prayer, the Confiteor, is that we get to ask our friends and family and everyone to pray for us..are you gonna turn down prayer? Anyone? Anyone at all? I know I absolutely need y'all to pray for me. And I will certainly be praying for you at every Mass I attend.

Next week we get to learn about something *really* cool, because it combines two parts of the Mass into one (nope, the Penitential Act isn't over quite yet). Check back next week to learn more about the Penitential Act and you'll find out what gets combined! SM

## Holy Water!

From the River Jordan to the little font hanging by your front door, Holy water has been a powerful symbol of Grace and Elessing. Most of us Catholics upon entering the Church dip our fingers lightly into the available holy water font and make the sign of the cross. Ahabit as automatic as shaking hands or salting French fries. Howmany of us knowwhen this all began, what it means, and the many uses of Holy Water? It is believed to date back to the first century, and some accounts relate to Saint Matthewand his uses. Long ago in the ancient world, water itself was a practical necessity of daily life. They used water for both physical washing and spiritual washing. They had to always cleanse themselves before entering the temple. Through history of Christianity, holy water has been one of the most visible and easily accessible symbols of the faith. Hbly water - water blessed by a priest- is know as a "sacramental", a sacred sign that bears a resemblance to the sacraments. The holy water as a sacramental receives its power through the prayer and authority of the Church. It is a reminder of baptism. It is used within the celebration of the sacraments. In funerals we sprinkle the body with water at the beginning of the ceremony and we bless the rings of marriage during a wedding ceremony. All of this is good but why holy water? What's the point? To begin with, holy water has the power to forgive venial sins. When we turn to God, remember our baptism when we vowed to reject sin and satan, our sins are forgiven! Holy water prepares us to receive the sacraments. Finally demons hate holy water. St. Teresa of Avila said "I have found by experience that there is nothing from which the devils fly more quickly than from holy water."
