28th Sunday of Yr. A -10/11/2020.Ref. 1st=Is.25:6-10a. 2nd=Phil.4:12-14,19-20. 3rd=Mtt.22:1-14. Theme: Accepting the invitation to enjoy the Goodness of God

Today, our God is specially inviting us to come and enjoy a banquet of love & satisfaction He has prepared for us. He wants us to make a 'movement' to a new location (different from where we are presently) in order to be part of this loving banquet. While the 1st reading talks about it in a future sense, the 3rd talks about it as ready – something we must be part of now or miss out forever.

The first point we note in this divine invitation is that it comes to us in two ways - collectively and individually. As a collective invitation, Isaiah says, 'The Lord of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food & choice wines...' (Is.25:6) and in the later part of the Gospel, the King sends out his servants to 'Go to the main roads & invite anyone they saw' (Mtt.22:9). On the other hand, the individual invitation is seen in the early part of the Gospel when the King 'sent his servants to call the invited guests to the feast' (Mtt.22:3). These tell us of our universal & individual salvation in Christ. This salvation is for/open to all but we partake of it by individually engrafting ourselves to it or drawing from it (as from a river of life). If we do not step out for it (for whatever reason), we miss out. This was why the 'invited guests' lost their opportunity & the 'man without his wedding garment' missed a golden chance. The choice is yours.

The second thing we observe is that a 'positive movement' from a former location to a new one is required of everyone invited. In the 1st reading, it is a 'movement to the mountain', while in the 3rd, it is to the 'home of the King'. To make these movements possible, early notices were given. These were to enable those invited to; a). Make the decision to go for the banquet. b). Be sure of the means or how to get there and c). To accept no other appointments on that day/time. But the invited guests ignored all these. Hence, when the banquet was ready, they refused to go, walked away to other engagements & easily engaged in acts of wickedness (on the messengers) to demonstrate a total rejection of the invitation. These are examples of how we reject the invitation to accept the Gospel message of love, repentance and salvation. To correct these, we should make the decision to make the 'positive movements' God expects of us (as Abraham did – Gen.12:1), seek the means or how to realize them (as Nicodemus did – Jn.3) & consider other engagements or relationships less important (as the Saints we celebrate in the Church did). Hence, we are called today to respond to the 'positive movement & dynamism' our relationships with God demand in order to enjoy the happiness & satisfaction that lies ahead. How ready are we?

Thirdly, we note from the 1st reading that God is aware of our difficulties, miseries, pain & sorrows and that only He can give us lasting joy & satisfaction both now & in eternity. Hence, He promises 'to remove the veil of sorrow covering all peoples, wipe away tears from every face, take away the disgrace of His people & destroy death forever' (Is.25:7-8). The exhaustive nature of these promises points to Christ. Through His mission marked with conversions, healings, miracles and finally death & resurrection removed the veil of sin covering us and defeated death & Satan for us. He replaced these with eternal happiness, victory & salvation (which we will enjoy when we respond to His invitations).

Lastly, the later part of the Gospel warns many of us who are hiding in 'the crowd of the Church'. The discovery of 'the man without his wedding garment' should be a lesson for us. God wants us to know that before Him, there is nothing to hide. Our sins will find us out & we will stand naked before Him on the last day. Therefore, we need to prepare ourselves for that time, putting on our wedding garments of righteousness (through charity, & repentance) in every circumstance & in all things. Don't be discouraged by the sacrifices you have to make to achieve this since, as Paul tells us (2nd reading), 'God will supply whatever we need according to the glorious riches in Christ Jesus' (Phil.4:19).

Dear friends, it is evident that our God has a burning desire to give us an eternal satisfaction & happiness. He knows how much we need this, even when we are still making other choices and looking unprepared. That is why He extends His invitation to us collectively & individually. Let us pray for strength to overcome all temptations to respond to God's loving invitation (in order to be with Him in the eternal joys & banquet of heaven). This invitation is still on. Remain blessed! Fr. Timothy.



Updated Information of Coronavirus at IHM

As of September 17, 2020 IHM <u>will be following</u> the latest COVID-19 restrictions. We are now allowed 200 capacity (the county says 50% capacity or 500, whichever is less) while maintaining **6 feet Social Distancing**. We are requiring the <u>Governor Mandated</u> wearing of

Face Coverings over the nose and mouth upon entering and moving throughout the building.

They can only be removed while sitting and 6 feet of social distancing is maintained between individuals or family groups.

Masks must be worn while singing. Any groups at IHM are still limited to 10 or fewer people and must be at least 6 feet
