

29<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Yr. A - 10/18/2020. Ref. 1<sup>st</sup>=Is.45:1,4-6. 2<sup>nd</sup>=1Thess.1:1-5b. 3<sup>rd</sup>=Mtt.22:15-21. Theme: Giving to God what belongs to Him

The crux of the question posed to Jesus in the Gospel of today is all about where our allegiance should go as children of God living in the world under human authorities & laws. His answer to the tricky question is very instructive. With the use of the word - image, Jesus gives an answer that shuts up those out to entrap Him. What does this tell us in relation to other readings today?

All authority belongs to God: Today, God wants us to understand that whatever authority we have in this world, whether you believe in God or not, comes from Him. Hence, He tells the pagan King - Cyrus (1st reading), 'It is I who arm you, though you do not know me, so that people may know that there is none besides me' (Is.45:4b-5). God has often demonstrated this in history. He taught this to Pharaoh when He bent him to allow Israel to leave Egypt (Ex.7-13) and to Emperor Constantine whom He led to an epic victory over Maxentius (AD, 312) with the sign of the cross (In hoc signo vinces). These teach all leaders & all with authority at whatever level that we are in such positions because God allowed it. Hence, we must not misuse or abuse such positions by approving policies that oppose the personality of God or policies that destroy life instead of improving it. We must also treat those under us with fairness no matter their faith, color or status. With this, God wants us to be obedient & respectful to those with authorities over us in our human societies (1Pt.2:13-14). This is exactly what Christ demonstrates in the Gospel. He supports the payment of taxes to the Roman Emperor, even when His fellow Jews are not comfortable with it. Also, by His intention to use a pagan King to liberate Israel (1st reading), God wants us to know that we all are His children and should live & work for His honor & glory. How peaceful will our world be if we can learn from this?

Nothing can obstruct God's power to save: Today, God wants us to know that what He cannot do does not exist. Whenever He steps out to save, heal or bless us, nothing can obstruct Him. At such moments, He turns anything that would have ordinarily been an obstruction into a means to making His name better known & glorified. He also wants us to know that there is no sin or unpleasant situation that can make Him forget us or turn His back on us. That is why, although the people of Israel had gone into exile because of their sins, God did abandon them. Hence, He is out to save them through an uncommon means — a pagan king. These tell us how loving & almighty our God is. As long as we can trust, believe & take hold of 'the second chance' God gives us, He will save us from whatever situation however He chooses. Miracles do happen!

To whom should our allegiance go? Jesus answers this by saying, 'give Caesar what belongs to Caesar & to God what belongs to God'. His answer is based on an index — image (which we see on our different means of economic transactions). With this, Jesus points out two types of allegiance — to man or state & to God. The allegiance to man or state changes from place to place as the image on our means of transactions changes. Hence, as his followers, Jesus wants us to know that we should keep the laws & constitutions of our different human societies (county, state, nation, etc.) and contribute to common good. But as we give to 'Caesar' what bears his image, we must also give to God what bears His image — the human being (as we are created in His image). Unfortunately, we are not as faithful in giving to God what belongs to Him as we are in giving to Caesar. We pay our tax, secure health insurance, car insurance, etc. but do so little to keep to our religious & spiritual responsibilities. We easily give excuses when it has to do with God. We must not forget that as defaulting in fulfilling our earthly obligations bring us punishment from human laws, defaulting in giving God what belongs to Him (ourselves) will bring us eternal regrets. The example of what happened to King Herod is a warning to us (Acts.12:21-23). Hence, Jesus wants us to fulfill both responsibilities for our earthly good & eternal happiness.

My dear friends, the strong love and saving power of God are all around us. He uses whomever He wants to achieve these in whatever situation & at whatever time. It is only when we recognize these, that we can properly give God the allegiance He deserves in our lives & societies. Hence, St. Paul commends the Thessalonians (2<sup>nd</sup> reading) who through their 'work of faith, labor of love & endurance in hope' (1Thess.1:3) have shown themselves true followers of Christ & good citizens in their society. It's now our turn to do the same.

The next part of Mass is interesting, because not many people know the *name* of what's to come. It is the Collect. It literally collects us together in prayer and community. If you check out the GIRM (don't you mean Germ? Don't we try to avoid germs!) I mean G.I.R.M! The General Instruction of the Roman Missal. Anyway, if you check out the GIRM it tells us about the Collect of Mass. There is a pause right before the prayer, collecting all of us with a short silence. And what do WE get to do during this silence? "...observe a brief silence so that (we) may be con-

scious of the fact that (we) are in God's presence and formulate (our) petitions mentally." Fantastic! We get a moment to get our prayers in order, and thus the Mass is for all of us, all our prayers and worries and concerns.

In ancient tradition (our wonderful church is old, old, old,—and we still do so many ancient things, that is so cool, because God is the same yesterday, today, and forever—holding to our traditions symbolizes that!) the Collect is most often addressed directly to God the Father, <a href="mailto:through">through</a> Christ, and <a href="mailto:in">in</a> the Holy Spirit. Keep an ear open for those underlined words, they are important, and you will hear them at <a href="mailto:every">every</a>—occasionally the collect will be directed to the Son instead. Even tradition based Catholics like to mix it up sometimes!

# **Updated Information of Coronavirus at IHM**

As of September 17, 2020 IHM will be following the latest COVID-19 restrictions. We are now allowed 200 capacity (the county says 50% capacity or 500, whichever is less) while maintaining 6 feet Social Distancing. We are requiring the Governor Mandated wearing of Face Coverings over the nose and mouth upon entering and moving throughout the building. They can only be removed while sitting and 6 feet of social distancing is maintained between individuals or family groups. Masks must be worn while singing. Any groups at IHM are still limited to 10 or fewer people and must be at least 6 feet apart from each other. Please practice personal hygiene and be respectful of your fellow parishioners.


