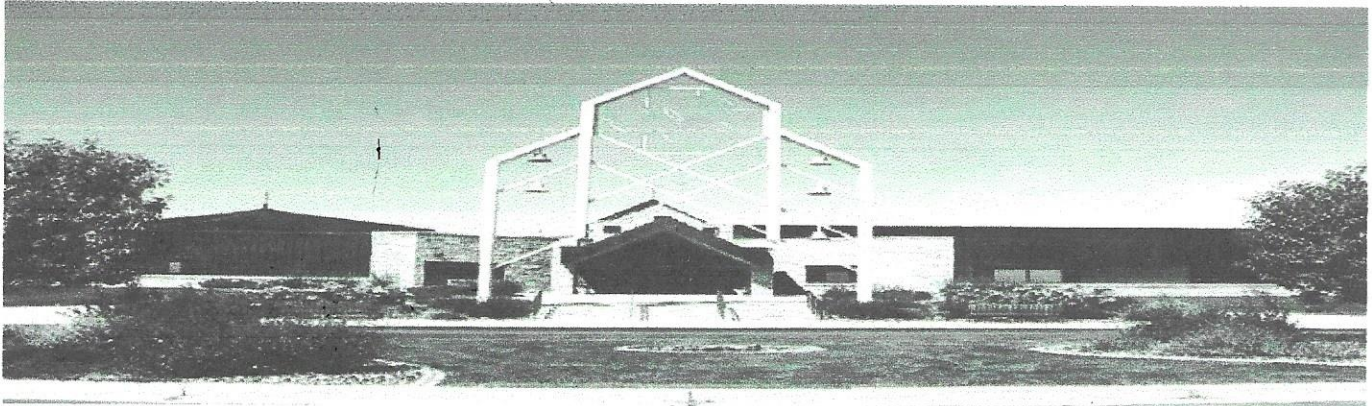

**30<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Yr. A – 10/25/2020. Ref. 1<sup>st</sup>=Ex.22:20-26. 2<sup>nd</sup>=1Thess.1:5c-10. 3<sup>rd</sup>=Mtt.22:34-40.**  
**Them: Returning Love for Love – the call of God's Commandments**

In His covenant with His people - Israel (Ex.20-24:8), God gave us His Commandments to keep His loving relationship with us intact (Ex.19:4-6a). He proved this further by sending Christ, to ensure that the power of Love conquers the power of sin (Jn3:16). Hence, Jesus tells us (3<sup>rd</sup> reading) that the greatest commandment of God is Love. This Love places God at the center of our lives. It is the heartbeat of sanctity, without it, virtue is dead. Hence, St. John says, 'God is Love' (1Jn.4:7-8). Today, in answer to the question posed to Him, Jesus tells us how to demonstrate this love.

**Loving God with everything in us:** Jesus wants us to love God with everything in us. Hence, He says, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul & with all your mind' (Mtt.22:37). As we know, these aspects of our being are what define us as rational beings. '**Loving God with your whole heart**' means worshiping & living for God with every emotion & passion in us. As it said, 'Lovers live in the heart'. This creates a loving relationship that longs to get out of the self and expressed with dedication & conviction because, 'Deep waters cannot quench love, nor floods sweep it away' (Songs.8:7). '**Loving God with all your soul**' means longing for & living in God 'as the life in us' (which He gave us at creation – Gen.2:7) the absence of which means death. And '**Loving with all your mind**' means applying our intellect & will in our worship of God. As St. Thomas Aquinas tells us, the human intellect evaluates & presents possible choices and the will freely makes the actual choice. Thus with knowledge provided by the intellect, the will freely makes choices, leading us to morally sound actions. These show depth of Christian love – Agape love, which motivated Christ to die for sinful humanity & motivates the Saints to live for God. It is in this sense that St. Faustina said, 'Love endures everything, it is stronger than death & it fears nothing'. But, does the love of God burn in our hearts, souls and minds as does our love for earthly things, their beauties & satisfactions? Your guess is as good as mine. The truth is that, until we learn to love God with every breath in us – with hearts, souls & minds, our lives of holiness and journey to heaven cannot start right or progress steadily. You can start today.

**Spreading the Lily of Love:** When the love of God takes roots in our hearts, souls & minds, our entire lives will start radiating God's love to all around us. That is how the 2<sup>nd</sup> type of love - '**To love your neighbor as yourself**', blossoms. Note that 'loving as yourself' does not mean 'the way you want – whether good or bad'. It means 'Loving as God loves you'. God's love for us is the determining factor, not our individual or misguided ways of loving because, 'God is Love'. Based on this, our love for our neighbors should be extensive & without boundaries. As St. Augustine said, 'The measure of love is to love without measure'. These account for the instructions from God in the 1<sup>st</sup> reading. He wants us to show love without boundaries & without counting costs to aliens, widows/widowers, orphans & the poor. We all must be personally involved, no matter how small. He does not want us to take advantage of their vulnerability to abuse them. Hence, He warns us today of His punishment on their behalf (Ex.22:22-24). God will do so because we have injured Love – which is Himself. This divine retribution may not be immediate as we saw in the story of Lazarus & the Rich man (Lk.16:19-31). On the other hand, by telling us of the necessity to return 'the borrowed neighbor's cloak before dusk', Jesus wants us to always show gratitude for the love we receive from others. It comes as a favor, not a right. Hence, we should appreciate it with a smile, an appreciative word or by working hard to change our vulnerable situations. Remember, 'it is more blessed to give than to receive'.

Dear friends, Love is the fulfilment of the law & a debt we owe each other. We were created in Love & are saved through it. Those who follow the path of God's love, see God in every person & in every situation. That is what Mother Theresa of Calcutta taught us in her life & apostolate among the poor. And, that is what St. Paul wants us to imitate (2<sup>nd</sup> reading). He wants us to become imitators of the Saints & of the Lord Jesus, receiving the word of God even in afflictions, with joy from the Holy Spirit to become models for all around us' (1Thess.1:6-8). May God help us!

Knights News

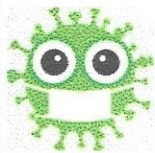

Updated Information of Coronavirus at IHM

As of October 6, 2020 IHM will be following the latest COVID-19 restrictions. We are now allowed 200 capacity (the county says 50% capacity or 500, whichever is less) while maintaining **6 feet Social Distancing**. We are requiring the **Governor Mandated** wearing of **Face Coverings over the nose and mouth** upon entering and moving throughout the building. They can only be removed while sitting and 6 feet of social distancing is maintained between individuals or family groups. Masks must be worn while singing. Any groups at IHM are still limited to 10 or fewer people and must be at least 6 feet apart from each other. Please practice personal hygiene and be respectful of your fellow parishioners.

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

In this series, you will learn all the Mass parts and the details of each part. We will go in depth...or at least give gentle reminders about when something happens\*, and why it is happening. Enjoy the tour!

Hello again, wonderful people of God! Are you ready to depart on today's journey? Today we are heading down a Jewish road (wait, what? I thought we are Christian...) Yes, we are Christian, but our ancestors, and Christ our Saviour himself were all Jewish! So it might behoove us to talk a little bit about it...especially as we dive head first into the Liturgy of the Word.

There are several sections to the Liturgy of the Word, but a great portion of it is made up of various readings from the Bible (usually 3 readings + 1 psalm, but sometimes we like to add a few extra [or subtract for a daily Mass]).

Reading the scriptures during the church service is a tradition we inherited from our Jewish ancestors, way back when they did so in the Synagogue (I say that as though they don't *still* do so now, when they do.). In fact, they read many of the same readings we read in the Catholic church, because many parts of the Tanakh (the Hebrew Bible) are the same as the Old Testament of the Catholic Bible.

The fact that we have access to these readings is so incredible because they are God, speaking to us (see that? The "Word") through inspired writers, and allowing us to see the mystery of His redemption and salvation that is open to us...Read that again, because wow! There is a lot of meaning in just a simple reading: Redemption and Salvation. That is because God's Word is so much more than just a word. We're going to go more in depth in the Liturgy of the Word, but just chew on this for a week, and if you are really excited to move ahead, go and read the GIRM 55-60. Check back in next week to find out more about the Liturgy of the Word! SM

With All Saints/All Souls Day almost upon us I thought I would give you all some fun Facts.

First of all what is the difference between the two?

All Saints Day is a celebration to honor the saints that have graced our world, and as a day to honor loved ones who have passed away.

Whereas All Souls' Day celebrates the departed who are not yet purified and have not reached Heaven.

Did you know the liturgical color of

All Saints' Day is white.

Pope Gregory IV made All Saints' Day a holiday in the year 837. Although the first All Saints' Day was celebrated in Rome in May of 609.

In Portuguese children go door to door receiving nuts, sweets, cakes & candies. Similar to our Halloween.

The football team New Orleans Saints was given that name because of New Orleans large Catholic population.

All Saints' Day is actually a public holiday in about 16 different countries, including Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Chile, Croatia, France, & Hungary.

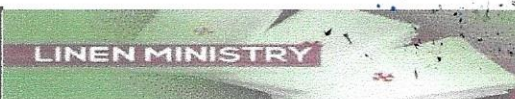
Looking for a way to help your church community?

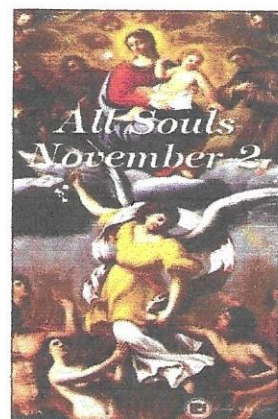

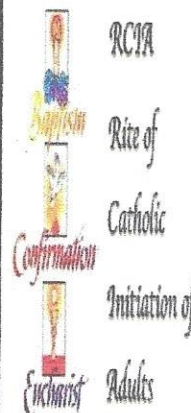

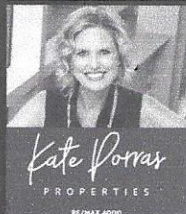
