



The Solemnity of Christ the King, Yr. A $- \frac{11}{22}/2020$. Ref. $1^{st} = Ezk.34:11-12,15-17$. $2^{nd} = 1Cor.15:20-26,28$. $3^{rd} = Mtt.25:31-46$. Theme: Jesus, the King who Serves and Rewards

In our celebration of Jesus as the King of the universe this year, the readings distinguish Him as a King who gives us so much in love but requests very little in return, a king whose leadership is marked by **service** & **rewards**. This celebration became a universal Church celebration in 1925 during the pontificate of Pope Pius XI to reemphasize the position of Jesus as the King & center of

our lives in a world that was increasingly becoming more secular. This makes this celebration very crucial in our world of today where the things of God & the worship of Him are considered less important by many people & many civil authorities. That was why, in his wisdom, the Pope Pius XI linked this solemnity to an annual consecration of humanity to the Most Sacred of Jesus.

The King who serves: Although He was born as a King to reestablish the dynasty of David (Lk.32-33), His Kingship is different & transcends that of King David or any other human king. His Kingship is distinguished by the qualities of a good shepherd. Hence, the 1st reading of today describes Him as a shepherd who comes to, 'seek out the lost, bring back the strayed, bind the injured, heal the sick and be their judge'. These show the beauty of our Lord & King – Jesus Christ. They further show that no one is excluded from His love & care no matter how ugly your situation looks. Each person is important and everyone has the surety & hope of liberation from misery, salvation from sin, security from harm and healing from sickness. What a merciful King! The Psalm of today – Ps.23, describes this very well. These show how unfortunate it will be for any of us not to accept Jesus as his/her personal King today.

The King who Rewards: Among the major duties of every king are to ensure 'reward for good deeds & punishment for evil deeds'. The aim of these is to encourage many more people to do good & to persist in doing good (even when it seems difficult & humanly discomforting). This is captured in the last sentence of the 1st reading which says, 'I will judge between one sheep & another, between rams & goats'. The process of this judgement is elaborated in the Gospel of today. The points considered by Jesus in this narrative show that 'little acts of love' matter so much for our salvation - feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, visiting the prisoner, etc. Happily enough, we all can do most of these, whether we are poor or rich. These are not just about what we give to others, but what we bring to their lives - joy, happiness, hope, reason to live on & godliness. Jesus wants us to know that no charitable act or good done to others goes unrewarded and that we get in return more than we give out. This happens because charity is more about the God in us, than the person the eyes see to be the receiver. Hence, we show charity not because we have so much but because there is something of God in us & because we see something of God in others. The story of St. Martin of Tours (celebrated every Nov. 11th) attests to this truth. We were told that while Martin was serving in the Roman army, he met a half-clothed man. He divided his cloak in two, giving half to him. That night, he saw Jesus in a vision telling the Angels, 'Martin, who is still a catechumen gave me this robe'. This vision changed Martin forever. That is why in his reply to those who have shown love to others (Gospel), Jesus said, 'Amen. I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me' (Mtt.25:40). For those who ignore this call to 'love the God in others', Jesus tells us today that such people will be denied love & the reward of heavenly inheritance on the last day. This will happen because they did not see God in their fellow humans for whatever reasons. Remember, 'there is always a reason not to do charity when we do not want to'. want to'.

My dear friends, to accept Jesus as King of the universe begins in our lives. It demands that we accept His ways & avoid acts that hurt Him. His ways, as we see today, are the ways of charity, righteousness & love. As we cannot do this by our strength only, let us then solicit for His loving & merciful help in prayer. May we go home today determined to show that Jesus is the true King of our world and show the same in our personal lives, marriages, families, job environment, by the policies we support in our civil society and by the choices we make in our daily lives. Jesus is Lord! **Remain blessed! Fr. Timothy.**

Updated Information of Coronavirus at IHM

As of November 7, 2020 IHM will be following the latest COVID-19 restrictions. We are allowed 50 person capacity at mass while maintaining 6 feet Social Distancing. We will be filtering people into the Hall or School Gym for separate masses if over 50 show up. We are requiring the Governor Mandated wearing of Face Coverings over the nose and mouth upon entering and moving throughout the building. They can only be removed while sitting and 6 feet of social distancing is maintained between individuals or family groups. Masks must be worn while singing. Any groups at IHM are still limited to 10 or fewer people and must be at least 6 feet apart from each other. Please practice personal

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global



Pandemic! Have we all been participating in Mass? Good! It really is fantastic how much we get to engage in this wonderful sacrifice and celebration.

Hark! The Gospel reading is here! Now the ordained reader (either Fr. Priest or Mr. Deacon) harkens back (...see what I did there...) to the beginning of Mass "The Lord be with you" and we respond "and with your spirit!" We got the chance to say this once before, way back at the start of Mass during the greeting (go back and read the 6th tour to recall the importance of this statement) and now we say it a second time during the middle of Mass.

Anyway, moving right along: "A reading from the Gospel according to (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John!)." At this point, just before the reading itself, another very powerful prayer occurs from the people of God (that's you and me!). The priest or deacon just announced the Gospel reading. And we respond with "Glory to You, O Lord." Oh, to my Lord be the Glory. Just the words alone are awesome—but we have an action that goes with these words, which makes the words even more meaningful. We each draw a cross on our foreheads, lips, and chests. Were you ever told why we do this? Again, it's a powerful prayer: may the lord be ever on my mind, on my lips, and in my heart. What a simple prayer, but if we possess those three things, we will be such great Missionary Disciples of Christ!

And this is the perfect time during Mass to say this prayer, because it's just before the Gospel. And Since "Gospel" means "good news," if we have the Lord always on our minds, on our lips, and in our hearts, then we will always be able to spread the good news of salvation to all the world. Saving souls, people! Bringing Christ to the world and helping Him to save souls. It's the most important thing any of us can do...and that's some gospel truth right there! What an exciting moment in the Mass just before we get to hear the words from our Christ! Did you know...The Thanksgiving that was celebrated by the Pilgrims of Massachusetts in 1621 was not the first Thanksgiving? There was a Catholic Thanksgiving of 1565 in Florida and another Catholic Thanksgiving of 1598 in Texas!

The first American Thanksgiving was celebrated on September 8, (Feast of the birth of the Blessed Virgin) 1565 in St. Augustine, Florida where the Timucuan Indians and Spanish settlers held a feast and the Holy Mass was offered.

The second American Thanksgiving happened on April 30, 1598 when Don Juan de Onate proclaimed "La Toma" claiming the land north of the Rio Grande for the King of Spain. He requested the friars to say a Mass of Thanksgiving. They feasted on duck, goose, and fish from the river.

Did you also know that Squanto, the beloved hero of Thanksgiving at Plymouth Rock, was actually baptized a Catholic? Squanto, his true name Tisquantum, was captured by a lieutenant of John Smith. The lieutenant attempted to sell Squanto and other Native Americans into slavery via Spain. Franciscan friars discovered the plot and acquired the captured Native Americans, including Squanto.

This is where he received instruction in the Catholic Faith and was baptized. As a free man he traveled to London where he worked in the shipyards. Here he learned and became fluent in English. He was able to return to his Native Land 5 years later.

Squanto became well-known and valuable to the English Pilgrims who settled at Plymouth. He taught them how to fertilize the ground, grow corn and where the best fishing was.
